Our Naturalist Journeys tour to Trinidad & Tobago began with a brief stay at Hacienda Jacana, six wonderful days at the newly renovated Asa Wright Nature Centre, and three days at the Cuffie River Nature Retreat for the Tobago Post-Tour extension. The tour included an evening boat trip in Caroni Marsh and a boat trip to Little Tobago Island on the extension. We saw 200 bird species on both islands and a large variety of reptiles and amphibians. The highlights of species seen included the return of Scarlet Ibis to their Caroni roost, hundreds of American Flamingos below the roost, the iconic Oilbirds and Bearded Bellbirds at Asa Wright, 14 species of hummingbirds, all three manakin species, and Red-billed Tropicbirds, Brown and Red-footed Booby on Little Tobago.

Yellow-throated Frog Mannophryne trinitatis---Seen on evening walk at Asa Wright
Mangrove tree boa Corallus ruschenbergerii—Spotted by Lester on Caroni Swamp boat trip
