Add to that several endemic breeders like Golden-cheeked Warbler and Black-capped Vireo and it was a wonderful trip. Besides the birds, seeing the seemingly never-ending river of bats at the Rio Frio bat cave is an unforgettable experience. The eclipse day was dramatic with clouds covering the sun most of the day, then miraculously clearing and giving us wonderful views of the eclipse during totality.
