Japan: Birding & Nature Species List | January 7-23, 2025 with Naturalist Journeys

Summary: Wonderful birding and wonderful group on this 16 day trip to Japan. Visited 3 Islands – Kyushu in the south, then Honshu, and Hokkaido in the North. A bit of odd weather this time – it was very cold in Kyushu and relatively mild in Hokkaido giving us similar temps throughout the tour.

Highlights included:

- Over 10,000 White-naped and Hooded Cranes in Kyushu
- A gorgeous male Copper Pheasant on Honshu
- Snow Monkeys (Japanese Macaque) in Nagano
- Amazing views of both Steller's Sea Eagle and White-tailed Eagle from our boat in Hokkaido
- Multiple views of Blakiston's Fish-Owl at our wonderful onsen

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Following is a list of the birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians we were fortunate to observe during the trip.

Mammals (8):

Eurasian Red Squirrel Sciurus vulgarus – A couple were hanging around the bird feeder at Yoroshi

Sea Otter Enhydra lutris – One was spotted just off the coast near the hide at Onnemoto

Japanese Badger Meles anakuma – We had one scurry up the bank near Kogawa Dam, then about an hr later Koichi found a few young ones hiding in a culvert and they would stick their heads out every few minutes

Red Fox *Vulpes vulpes* – common in Hokkaido. Especially good looks on the Notsuke Peninsula **Spotted Seal** *Phoca Largha* – A few were sighted just offshore near the end of the Nemuro Peninsula **Japanese Macaque** *Macaca fuscata* – we had a great day at Jigokudani watching them play in the hot springs and running around the area. Also had a small group hanging out near an abandoned shop near Karuizawa

Japanese Serow *Capricornis crispus* – Had wonderful views of one standing just a few feet from the bus. It hardly moved and we spent a while watching it and taking photos

Sika Deer – Cervus nippon – Common and seen daily in Hokkaido, especially great views of several males along the Notsuke Peninsula
