Captivating Croatia: Birding the Adriatic Coast April 8–20, 2025 | Species List | by Amelia Morrow

This immersive birding tour through Croatia begins in the capital city of Zagreb and quickly ventures into the richly diverse habitats of the River Kupa Basin. Here, we explored woodlands, wetlands, and farmlands teeming with early spring migrants and nesting species such as White Stork, various raptors, and a wide range of tits and waterfowl. Moving southward, the tour stops in the charming port town of Skradin, the gateway to Krka National Park. Over two days in this karstic landscape, participants enjoy boat rides, cascades, and striking Mediterranean scenery while spotting species like Pygmy Cormorant, Blue Rock Thrush, and Gray Wagtail, along with a fascinating variety of amphibians, butterflies, and dragonflies.

Continuing along the scenic Adriatic coast, we visited Lake Vrana, the Nin salt pans, and the historical town of Nin, rich in both birdlife and cultural heritage. We then headed to the starkly beautiful island of Pag, where dry stone walls and sage-covered hillsides host species like Little Owl, Rock Partridge, and Eurasian Thick-knee, while wetlands and bays attract herons, raptors, and migrating wagtails. To round out the journey, the tour concluded with time spent exploring the dramatic canyons and forests of Paklenica National Park, a pristine corner of the Velebit Mountains known for its raptors and striking karst scenery—a perfect finale to a richly varied and rewarding Croatian nature adventure.
