### **Birds**

Gadwall Anas strepera— Pair at Lake Balmorhea

"Mexican Duck" (Mallard) A. platyrhynchos—seen well at Lake Balmorhea

**Blue-winged Teal** A. discors—4 seen in a roadside pond between Ft. Davis and Alpine

Cinnamon Teal A. cyanoptera—Nice looks at above roadside pond

Northern Shoveler A. clypeata—at Lake Balmorhea

Green-winged Teal A. crecca— 2 at Lake Balmorhea

Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis—30+ at Lake Balmorhea

**Scaled Quail** *Callipepla squamata*— Coveys en route to and from Big Bend, Dugout Wells and Rio Grande Village

Gambel's Quail C. gambelii— Several at El Paso Archaeological Museum/Nature Center

**Montezuma Quail** *Cyrtonyx montezumae*— Female at roadside picnic area near Davis Mountains State Park

Pied-billed Grebe Podilymbus podiceps— In large swimming pool at Balmorhea State Park

Eared Grebe Podiceps nigricollis— 5 at Lake Balmorhea

Western Grebe Aechmophorus occidentalis—at least 2 at Lake Balmorhea

Clark's Grebe A. clarkii—10 at Lake Balmorhea, giving a good comparison with the Westerns

**Great Blue Heron** *Ardea herodias*— 1 at Lake Balmorhea

Great Egret Ardea alba— 1 at Lake Balmorhea

**Snowy Egret** *Egretta thula*— 2 at Balmorhea State Park

**Green Heron** *Butorides virescens*— 1 on Nature Trail board walk at Rio Grande Village, Big Bend N.P.

White-faced Ibis Plegadis chihi—about 20 on NW shore of Lake Balmorhea

**Black Vulture** *Coragyps atratus*—5 in the vicinity of Rio Grande Village

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura—throughout

Northern Harrier Circus cyaneus— 1 at Lake Balmorhea

Cooper's Hawk A. cooperii—1 in the Davis Mountains

**Common Black-Hawk** *Buteogallus anthracinus*—2 nesting hawks scoped at Rio Grande Village

Gray Hawk Buteo nitidus— A nesting pair at Cottonwood Campground

**Swainson's Hawk** *B. swainsoni*—1 near Lake Balmorhea and others en route to and from Big Bend and Ft. Davis

**Zone-tailed Hawk** B. albonotatus—1 near Prairie Dog town north of Marathon

**Red-tailed Hawk** *B. jamaicensis*—seen throughout in small numbers

Golden Eagle Aquila chrysaetos – 1 on a power pole at Marathon's western city limit

American Kestrel Falco sparverius— 1 along Hwy 20 east of El Paso

**Wild Turkey** *Meleagris gallopavo*— Three greeted us to Madera Canyon picnic area in the Davis Mountains

Virginia Rail Rallus limicola – Beautiful close look at Cienega at Balmorhea State Park

Sora Porzana carolina— Heard several at The Post County Park south of Marathon

American Coot Fulica americana—about 3 at pond near entrance of Balmorhea State Park

Piping Plover Charadrius melodus – a rare find, but one we studied at length at Lake Balmorhea

Killdeer Charadrius vociferus— Several at Bamorhea State Park

**Black-necked Stilt** *Himantopus mexicanus*— 20+ at Lake Balmorhea

American Avocet Recurvirostra americana—10+ at Lake Balmorhea

**Spotted Sandpiper** *Actitis macularius* —2 at Lake Balmorhea

Greater Yellowlegs Tringa melanoleuca—2 in mudflats on west shore of Lake Balmorhea

**Least Sandpiper** *C. minutilla*—a flock of 4 at Lake Balmorhea

Long-billed Dowitcher Limnodromus scolopaceus -10 on west side of Lake Balmorhea

Wilson's Phalarope Phalaropus tricolor— 3 on west side of Lake Balmorhea

Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis— 1 followed us around Lake Balmorhea

Rock Pigeon Columba livia-present in towns throughout, including El Paso, Ft. Davis & Alpine

Forster's Tern Sterna forsteri – A group of 7 on Lake Balmorhea

Eurasian Collared-Dove Streptopelia decaocto—seen in cities like El Paso and Van Horn

White-winged Dove Zenaida asiatica—common everywhere, except high in the Chisos Mountains

Mourning Dove Z. macroura—seen most days except on the hike to Boot Springs

Common Ground-Dove C. passerina—2 at Rio Grande Village in campground near store

**Greater Roadrunner** *Geococcyx californianus*—these engaging characters were seen most days!

**Great Horned Owl** *Bubo virginianus* – Great look on nest in Cottonwood, Balmorhea State Park

**Elf Owl** *Micrathene whitneyi*— 1 seen at dusk at Dugout Wells, Big Bend National Park

Burrowing Owl Athene cunicularia— 1 at construction site north of I-10 near Clint exit

**Lesser Nighthawk** *Chordeiles acutipennis*— several flying at dusk near van we drove to Dugout Wells; others seen near Van Horn on drive back to El Paso

Common Poorwill Phalaenoptilus nuttallii – 1 heard clearly and repeatedly at Dugout Wells

**White-throated Swift** *Aeronautes saxatalis*— Several above the roadside pond between Ft. Davis and Alpine; more in the high Chisos and in Santa Elena Canyon.

**Lucifer Hummingbird** *Calothorax Lucifer* – 5 seen at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Magnificent Hummingbird Eugenes fugens – Seen frequently around Chisos Basin Lodge

**Black-chinned Hummingbird** Archilochus alexandri—the commonly seen hummer throughout

**Belted Kingfisher** *Ceryle alcyon* – Spotted at the Post reservoir near Marathon

Acorn Woodpecker Melanerpes formicivorus—in the Davis and the Chisos Mountains

**Golden-fronted Woodpecker** *M. aurifrons*—the common, conspicuous woodpecker at Rio Grande Village, Cottonwood Campground and the Post

**Ladder-backed Woodpecker** *Picoides scalaris*— Several, usually in Chihuahuan Desert habitats

**Northern Flicker** *Colaptes auratus*— One in the Davis Mountains

Olive-sided Flycatcher Contopus cooperi—1 at Rio Grande Village, its "vest" in plain sight

**Western Wood-Pewee** *C. sordidulus*—a few of this usually-common flycatcher, encountered in the Davis Mountains

**Gray Flycatcher** *E. wrightii*— Seen in the Davis Mountains

**Dusky Flycatcher** *E. oberholseri*—One along the trail to Boot Springs

Cordilleran Flycatcher E. occidentalis— One at entrance to the Post County Park, Marathon

Eastern Phoebe Sayornis phoebe – One at Rio Grande Village

Say's Phoebe S. saya—several in Balmorhea State Park and Chisos Basin

**Vermilion Flycatcher** *Pyrocephalus rubinus*—a favorite, these exquisite flycatchers were common at Balmorhea State Park, Cottonwood Campground & the Post

**Ash-throated Flycatcher** *Myiarchus cinerascens*—several at Davis and the Chisos Mountains **Brown-crested Flycatcher** *M. tyrannulus*—the large, vocal flycatcher in the campground in Rio Grande Village

Cassin's Kingbird T. vociferans—common in Davis Mountains

Couch's Kingbird T. couchii – One found at Rio Grande Village, another at Cottonwood C.G.

Western Kingbird T. verticalis—common and widespread, seen most days

**Scissor-tailed Flycatcher** *T forficatus* – Great looks at the Marathon Post of them perching and feeding; another good look along the road from Big Bend to Marathon.

**Loggerhead Shrike** *Lanius ludovicianus*—a few along highways en route to and from Big Bend **Bell's Vireo** *Vireo bellii*—at least a dozen at Rio Grande Village (where we were eventually rewarded with good views) and many elsewhere, where shrubs were dense. Its song was a constant in most areas visited in Big Bend N.P.

Plumbeous Vireo V. plumbeus—1 in the Davis Mountains

Western Scrub-Jay Aphelocoma californica—in the Davis Mountains

**Mexican Jay** *A. ultramarina*—these bright blue birds belong to the race *woodhousi*, different from the race in Arizona; they were seen close-up and often in the Chisos Mountains

**Chihuahuan Raven** *Corvus cryptoleucus*—frequent along Highways 20, 90, and I-10 as we drove from and to El Paso

Northern Raven C. corax—in the Davis and Chisos Mountains, with a few in the lower regions

**Tree Swallow** *Tachycineta bicolor* – 12 or so at roadside pond between Ft. Davis and Alpine

**Violet-green Swallow** *Tachycineta thalassina*— 6 in the same roadside pond

Northern Rough-winged Swallow Stelgidopteryx serripennis— Several in same roadside pond

Cliff Swallow Petrochelidon pyrrhonota— Many in Balmorhea State Park

Cave Swallow P. fulva—a small colony at the Van Horn underpass on I-10

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica—throughout, seen most days except for the hike to Boot Springs

**Black-crested Titmouse** *Baeolophus atricristatus*—in the Davis Mountains at the TNC preserve and the state park; also in the Chisos Mountains

Verdin Auriparus flaviceps— Several at Dugout Wells, Big Bend N.P.

Bushtit Psaltriparus minimus – A few in the brush on the edge of meadows in Davis Mountains

White-breasted Nuthatch Sitta carolinensis—5 in the Davis Mountains

Brown Creeper Certhia Americana – 1 found creeping up a tree in the high Chisos Mountains

Cactus Wren Campylorhynchus brunneicapillus—seen in Ocotillo at El Paso Archaeological Museum grounds; again in Davis Mountains; also frequently heard and seen in Big Bend

**Rock Wren** Salpinctes obsoletus— 1 encountered at Madera Canyon Picnic Area in the Davis Mountains, then several at Chisos Basin Campground

**Canyon Wren** *Catherpes mexicanus*—heard and seen in the Davis Mountains; heard well on the Pinnacles Trail while looking at Colima Warbler

Bewick's Wren Thryomanes bewickii—common in the Davis and Chisos Mountains

House Wren Troglodytes aedon— Several on the Pinnacles and Laguna Meadows Trail

**Ruby-crowned Kinglet** *Regulus calendula*—Many, mostly in the Davis Mountains and along the trail to Boot Spring

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher Polioptila caerulea—Many along the trail to Boot Spring

Black-tailed Gnatcatcher P. melanura— 3 seen in brush bordering Rio Grande Campground

**Western Bluebird** *Sialia mexicana*— 3 lovely birds, seen well at nesting hole in Davis Mountains

**Hermit Thrush** *Catharus guttatus*— A fair number seen one at a time in Davis Mountains, a the high Chisos Mountains along the trail to Boot Spring, at Sam Nail Ranch and Christmas Mountains Oasis

American Robin Turdus migratorius— Just 1 at Balmorhea State Park

Northern Mockingbird Mimus polyglottos—a conspicuous species, seen daily

**Curve-billed Thrasher** *T. curvirostre*—first seen well in Davis Mountains, several more in Big Bend and Christmas Mountains Oasis

Crissal Thrasher T. crissale—1 great look at Rio Grande Village in brush behind store

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris—small groups in El Paso & Fort Davis

American Pipit Anthus rubescens— Several seen on shore of Lake Balmorhea

**Phainopepla** *Phainopepla nitens*— 1 of this elegant silky-flycatcher in Davis Mountains

Orange-crowned Warbler Vermivora celata—only 1, at Sam Nail Ranch

Nashville Warbler V. ruficapilla—One at Sam Nail Ranch

**Colima Warbler** *V. crissalis*— Close encounter with one just below (west) of Toll Mountain Pass and another good sighting of a second Colima along the Pinnacles trail and near Boot Spring

**Black-throated Blue Warbler** *Dendroica caerulescens* – One rare and fantastic look in the wetlands on the north side of the Post reservoir.

**Yellow-rumped Warbler**, *Audubon's form Dendroica coronata*—common at El Paso Archaeological Museum; Lake Balmorhea, in the Davis Mountains, Rio Grande Village, along the Pinnacles Trail, and especially in the filtration pond at Chisos Basin Campground

**Townsend's Warbler** *D. townsendi*—5 along the Pinnacles Trail and several at Chisos Basin **Ovenbird** *Seiurus aurocapillus* – One at filtration pond at Chisos Basin Campground seen several times clearly by most in our group

Common Yellowthroat Geothlypis trichas—heard only, at Rio Grande Village's small wetland Wilson's Warbler Wilsonia pusilla—the most frequently encountered migrant warbler, seen every day

**Painted Redstart** *Myioborus pictus* – 2 near Boot Springs while looking for Colima Warbler **Yellow-breasted Chat** *Icteria virens*—several at Rio Grande Village in exuberant display, plus others at Sam Nail Ranch and Christmas Mountains Oasis

Hepatic Tanager Piranga flava—several in Davis Mountains

**Summer Tanager** *P. rubra*—several in Davis Mountains State Park, Balmorhea State Park, Rio Grande Village, and Cottonwood Campground

**Western Tanager** *P. ludoviciana*—this beautiful tanager was encountered in Davis and Chisos Mountains

**Green-tailed Towhee** *Pipilo chlorurus*— First found at Ft. Davis and later seen at several locations in Big Bend N.P.

**Spotted Towhee** *P. maculatus*—3 in the Chisos Mountains on the way to Boot Springs **Canyon Towhee** *P. fuscus*—small groups seen almost daily

**Rufous-crowned Sparrow** *Aimophila ruficeps*—seen well in Davis Mountains, at Madge Lindsay's house

Chipping Sparrow Spizella passerina—very common throughout

Clay-colored Sparrow S. pallida—3 seen at Christmas Mountains Oasis

**Brewer's Sparrow** *S. breweri*—First seen and heard at El Paso Archaeological Museum; later seen often at Balmorhea State Park and at the Post

**Vesper Sparrow** *Pooecetes gramineus*—a few of this wintering species still present, best seen at Lake Balmorhea and at the Post

**Lark Sparrow** *Chondestes grammacus*—a striking species, seen very well at Rio Grande Village and even in the Chisos Basin parking lot!

**Black-throated Sparrow** *Amphispiza bilineata*—a desert specialist, this dapper sparrow was seen best at El Paso Archaeological Museum and in the Davis Mountains

**Lark Bunting** Calamospiza melanocorys—Quite a few on Lake Balmorhea and several more at the Post

Savannah Sparrow Passerculus sandwichensis—single at the Post spotted by Mary

Lincoln's Sparrow Melospiza lincolnii—only 1, at the Post, just below the dam

**White-crowned Sparrow** *Zonotrichia leucophrys*—small groups of both the *oriantha & gambeli* races still lingered at most sites

**Dark-eyed Junco** *Junco hyemalis* – A handful in the Davis Mountains

**Northern Cardinal** *Cardinalis cardinalis*—a few at Balmorhea State Park, in the Davis Mountains, and in riparian areas throughout Big Bend's lower elevations

**Pyrrhuloxia** *C. sinuatus*—beautiful relative of the cardinal, seen well in Davis Mountains, at Rio Grande Village and elsewhere in Big Bend's Chihuahuan Desert habitats

**Black-headed Grosbeak** *Pheucticus melanocephalus*—regularly encountered in Davis Mountains and Big Bend NP

Blue Grosbeak Passerina caerulea— 4 seen well in grass at the Post

**Lazuli Bunting** *Passerina amoena* – First seen at Post by Mary, then seen repeatedly in Chisos **Indigo Bunting** *P. cyanea*—another beauty, enjoyed at the Post

**Varied Bunting** *P. versicolor*—a gem, seen by two of us at Sam Nail Ranch and by all at Christmas Mountains Oasis

**Painted Bunting** *P. ciris*—great views of this stunning bird at Rio Grande Village and Cottonwood Campground

**Red-winged Blackbird** *Agelaius phoeniceus*—a number seen at Balmorhea State Park and Lake Balmorhea

**Eastern Meadowlark** *Sternella magna*—individuals were seen and heard best around Chisos Basin Lodge

Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta – Seen and heard in Davis Mountains

**Yellow-headed Blackbird** *Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus*— Many along road to Ft. Davis; several more along well-hidden along road to Big Bend

**Brewer's Blackbird** *Euphagus cyanocephalus*— a dozen or so mixed in with Yellow-headed Blackbirds on road to Ft. Davis

Great-tailed Grackle *Quiscalus mexicanus*—abundant in El Paso and other towns

**Brown-headed Cowbird** *Molothrus ater*— 5 at Balmorhea State Park

**Bronzed Cowbird** *Molothrus aeneus* – 1 identified by Carol Edwards in the Davis Mountains **Orchard Oriole** *Icterus spurius*—1 at the Post spotted by Jane

**Bullock's Oriole** *I. bullockii*— One at Dugout Wells near above our picnic table; singles at Cottonwood Campground and Christmas Mountains Oasis

**Scott's Oriole** *I. parisorum*—Seen well on nature trail at El Paso Archaeological Museum **House Finch** *Carpodacus mexicanus*—seen throughout

Pine Siskin Carduelis pinus—numerous at Davis and Christmas Mountains feeders;

**Lesser Goldfinch** *C. psaltria*—several at Balmorhea State Park and at the Post

House Sparrow Passer domesticus—common in towns throughout

#### **Mammals**

**Desert Cottontail** *Sylvilagus auduboni*—common in lower elevations

Black-tailed Jack Rabbit Lepus californicus—1 seen from highway entering Big Bend N.P.

Mexican Ground Squirrel Spermophilus mexicanus—2 at Balmorhea State Park

**Rock Squirrel** S. variegatus—many in the Chisos Basin

**Black-tailed Prairie Dog** *Cynomys ludovicianus*— 6 seen in two dog colonies near Marathon **Collared Peccary (Javelina)** *Tayassu tajacu*— At least 12 seen in Davis and Chisos Mountains **White-tailed Deer** *O. virginianus*—common in the Davis Mountains and at higher elevatons in Big Bend; this race is the Carmen Mountains White-tail

Mule Deer Odocoileus hemionus – Several small herds in the Davis Mountains

**Pronghorn** *Antilocapra americana*— About 20 total south of Marathon and between Fort Davis and Alpine

**American Black Bear** *Ursus americanus*—a sow with 3 cubs at Chisos Basin filtration pond **American Badger** *Taxidea taxus* – 1 running behind first Prairie Dog town

Coyote Canis latrans – 1 hefty coyote ran across I-20 near Marfa

Rocky Mountain Elk Cervus Canadensis – John found 2 below the Davis Mountains overlook Cougar Puma concolor – Distinct tracks found and howling heard by Mary and Sylvia at Chisos Basin

#### **Reptiles**

Greater Earless Lizard (Southwestern race) Cophosaurus texanus scitulus—Many in Big Bend Common Snapping Turtle Chelydra serpentine – Relaxing near pond at Balmorhea State Park Blotched Water Snake Nerodia erythrogaster transversa -- Swimming in water at Cienega overlook, Balmorhea State Park

#### **Ampibians**

**Leopard Frog** *Rana blairi* – In Cienega at Balmorhea State Park **American Bull Frog** *Rana catesbeiana* – Heard too well at Rio Grande Village wetlands

#### <u>Invertebrates we noted along the way...</u>

**Tarantula Hawk** *Pepsis Formosa* – Abundant wasp that preys upon Tarantulas seen throughout Chihuahuan Desert

**Flame Skimmer** *Libellula saturate* – In wet areas of Davis and Chisos Mountains **Blue-eyed Darner** *Rhionaeschna multicolor* – In ponds and backwaters of Big Bend Park
