Mallard Anas platyrhynchos - One pair at Lake Balmorhea

"Mexican Duck" (Mallard) A. platyrhynchos—seen well on Rio Grande River

Blue-winged Teal A. discors— Many seen in a roadside pond near Marathon

Northern Shoveler A. clypeata— Many at McNary Reservoir and Lake Balmorhea

Redhead Aythya Americana – A few on Lake Balmorhea

Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis— On McNary Reservoir and Lake Balmorhea

Scaled Quail Callipepla squamata—Balmorhea SP, Davis Mountains SP, and Big Bend NP

Wild Turkey Meleagris gallopavo - Nature Conservancy preserve, Davis Mountains

Pied-billed Grebe *Podilymbus podiceps*— Balmorhea State Park

Eared Grebe Podiceps nigricollis—McNary Reservoir, Lake Balmorhea

Western Grebe Aechmophorus occidentalis—Lake Balmorhea

Clark's Grebe A. clarkii—McNary Reservoir and Lake Balmorhea

Double-crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus* – McNary Reservoir

American White Pelican Pelecanus erythrorhynchos – McNary Reservoir

Great Blue Heron Ardea herodias— Lake Balmorhea, Rio Grande River

Snowy Egret Egretta thula— McNary Reservoir, Lake Balmorhea, Rio Grande River

Green Heron Butorides virescens—Nature Trail at Rio Grande Village, Big Bend N.P.

White-faced Ibis Plegadis chihi—NW shore of Lake Balmorhea; Rio Grande River

Black Vulture *Coragyps atratus*—5 in the vicinity of Rio Grande Village

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura—throughout

Osprey *Pandion haliaetus* – 1 at Lake Balmorhea

Northern Harrier Circus cyaneus— Rio Grande Village and Santa Elena Canyon

Cooper's Hawk A. cooperii—Pair nesting in the Davis Mountains TNC preserve

Gray Hawk Buteo nitidus— A nesting pair at Daniel's Ranch, Rio Grande Village

Swainson's Hawk B. swainsoni— Nesting Pair near Balmorhea S.P.; others along road

Red-tailed Hawk B. jamaicensis—seen throughout in small numbers

American Kestrel Falco sparverius— El Paso Archaeological Museum; near Balmorhea S.P.

Sora Porzana carolina— Seen well at Balmorhea State Park Cienega

American Coot Fulica americana—McNary Reservoir and Balmorhea State Park

Killdeer Charadrius vociferus— Seen at wetlands at Balmorhea SP; Davis Mtns; Rio Grande

Black-necked Stilt Himantopus mexicanus— McNary Reservoir; Lake Balmorhea

American Avocet Recurvirostra americana—Lake Balmorhea

Western Sandpiper Calidris mauri —5 at Lake Balmorhea NW shore

Least Sandpiper Calidris minutilla – 1 at Lake Balmorhea NW shore

Long-billed Dowitcher *Limnodromus scolopaceus* –Several on west side of Lake Balmorhea

Wilson's Phalarope Phalaropus tricolor—McNary Reservoir; Lake Balmorhea

Franklin's Gull Leucophaeus pipixcan – Small flock on Lake Balmorhea

Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis—Lake Balmorhea

Forster's Tern Sterna forsteri – A few on Lake Balmorhea

Rock Pigeon Columba livia-present in El Paso, Marathon

Eurasian Collared-Dove Streptopelia decaocto—seen in cities and along roads

White-winged Dove Zenaida asiatica—common everywhere, except high Chisos Mountains

Mourning Dove Z. macroura—seen most days except on the hike to Boot Springs

Inca Dove *Columbina passerina* – Several in Cottonwood Campground, Big Bend N.P.

Greater Roadrunner Geococcyx californianus—seen 3 days -1 with lizard at Rio Grande Village

Great Horned Owl Bubo virginianus – On nest with young in Cottonwood, Balmorhea State Park

Elf Owl Micrathene whitneyi— 1 seen at dusk at Dugout Wells, Big Bend National Park

Burrowing Owl Athene cunicularia— 1 at construction site north of I-10 near Clint exit

Lesser Nighthawk Chordeiles acutipennis—several flying at dusk, Dugout Wells, Big Bend NP

Common Nighthawk Chordeiles minor – Balmorhea State Park

White-throated Swift Aeronautes saxatalis—In high Chisos and in Santa Elena Canyon.

Blue-throated Hummingbird Lampornis clemenciae – Pair near Chisos Basin Campground

Lucifer Hummingbird Calothorax Lucifer – Several seen at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Magnificent Hummingbird Eugenes fugens – Davis Mountains and around Chisos Basin Lodge

Black-chinned Hummingbird *Archilochus alexandri*— Commonly seen hummer throughout

Broad-tailed Hummingbird Selasphorus platycercus – Davis Mountains TNC preserve

Belted Kingfisher Ceryle alcyon – Balmorhea State Park and Lake Balmorhea

Acorn Woodpecker Melanerpes formicivorus—Many in the Davis and the Chisos Mountains

Golden-fronted Woodpecker *M. aurifrons*—Common, conspicuous woodpecker at Rio Grande Village, Cottonwood Campground and the Post

Ladder-backed Woodpecker *Picoides scalaris*— Balmorhea SP; Davis Mtns; the Post; Rio Grande Village; Cottonwood Campground

Northern Flicker Colaptes auratus— One heard on Boot Springs hike

Olive-sided Flycatcher Contopus cooperi—1 at Davis Mountains

Buff-breasted Flycatcher *Empidonax fulvifrons* – Two of these rare flycatchers seen well through spotting scope high in Ponderosa Pines at TNC Davis Mountains preserve

Dusky Flycatcher *E. oberholseri*—One along the trail to Boot Springs

Say's Phoebe S. saya—common in Balmorhea State Park, Davis Mtns and Chisos Basin

Vermilion Flycatcher *Pyrocephalus rubinus*—these brilliantly-colored flycatchers were common at Balmorhea State Park, Cottonwood Campground & the Post

Ash-throated Flycatcher *Myiarchus cinerascens*—Davis Mtns.; The Post; Chisos Mountains

Brown-crested Flycatcher *M. tyrannulus*— Cottonwood Campground, Big Bend NP

Tropical Kingbird Tyrannus melancholicus – Several at Rio Grande Village, Big Bend NP

Couch's Kingbird T. couchii – Several at Cottonwood C.G.

Cassin's Kingbird T. vociferans—common in Davis Mountains

Western Kingbird T. verticalis—common and widespread, seen most days

Scissor-tailed Flycatcher *T forficatus* – Great looks at Balmorhea, Gage Gardens, Marathon.

Loggerhead Shrike Lanius ludovicianus—a few along highway en route to and from Big Bend

Bell's Vireo *Vireo bellii*—at least a dozen at Rio Grande Village and many elsewhere in dense Mesquite thickets. Its song was a constant in most areas in Big Bend N.P.

Plumbeous Vireo *V. plumbeus*—1 in the Davis Mountains

Hutton's Vireo *Vireo huttoni* – 4 heard clearly on Boot Springs hike

Western Scrub-Jay Aphelocoma californica—in the Davis Mountains

Mexican Jay *A. ultramarina*—these bright blue birds belong to the race *woodhousi*, different from the race in Arizona; they were seen close-up and often in the Chisos Mountains

Chihuahuan Raven *Corvus cryptoleucus*—frequent along Highways 20, 90, and I-10 at Lake Balmorhea and as we drove from and to El Paso

Northern Raven *C. corax*—in the Davis and Chisos Mountains, with a few in the lower regions

Violet-green Swallow Tachycineta thalassina— At nature trail, Rio Grande Village

Northern Rough-winged Swallow Stelgidopteryx serripennis— Several at Santa Elena Canyon

Cliff Swallow Petrochelidon pyrrhonota—Balmorhea State Park, Chisos Mountains, Rio Grande

Cave Swallow P. fulva— Small colony, McNary underpass on I-10; few at Van Horn underpass

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica—throughout, seen most days except for the hike to Boot Springs

Black-crested Titmouse *Baeolophus atricristatus*—in the Davis Mountains at the TNC preserve; also in the Chisos Mountains

Verdin *Auriparus flaviceps*— Rio Grande Village, Big Bend NP

White-breasted Nuthatch Sitta carolinensis—Davis Mountains

Pygmy Nuthatch *Sitta pygmaea* – Boot Springs, Chisos Mountains

Cactus Wren *Campylorhynchus brunneicapillus*—Common in Ocotillo at El Paso Archaeological Museum grounds; Davis Mountains; throughout Big Bend NP

Rock Wren Salpinctes obsoletus— Common on dry rocky slopes on Davis Mtns; Chisos Mtns

Canyon Wren *Catherpes mexicanus*—Descending song heard in Davis and Chisos Mtns, seen at Fort Davis

Bewick's Wren Thryomanes bewickii—common in the Davis and Chisos Mountains

Ruby-crowned Kinglet *Regulus calendula*—Many, mostly in the Davis Mountains and along the trail to Boot Spring

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher *Polioptila caerulea*—Many along the trail to Boot Spring

Black-tailed Gnatcatcher P. melanura— Seen in brush bordering Rio Grande Campground

Western Bluebird Sialia mexicana— Several at Nature Conservancy preserve, Davis Mountains

Hermit Thrush Catharus guttatus— One at Boot Springs, Chisos Mountains

American Robin turdus migratorius—Balmorhea State Park and Gage Gardens in Marathon

Northern Mockingbird Mimus polyglottos—ubiquitous, seen and heard daily

Curve-billed Thrasher T. curvirostre—Fabulous look twice at Panther Junction Visitor Center

European Starling *Sturnus vulgaris*—small groups in El Paso & Fort Davis

American Pipit Anthus rubescens— Several seen on NW shore of Lake Balmorhea

Black-and-white Warbler *Mniotilta varia* – One very nice look on Boot Springs hike

Orange-crowned Warbler Vermivora celata—only 1, Chisos Basin

Colima Warbler V. crissalis— Four heard near Pinnacles, one seen briefly near Boot Springs

Common Yellowthroat Geothlypis trichas—Seen at the Post, Rio Grande Village's wetland

Yellow Warbler Setophaga petechia – The Post, Marathon

Yellow-rumped Warbler, Audubon's form *Dendroica coronata*—common at El Paso Archaeological Museum; Lake Balmorhea, in the Davis Mountains, Rio Grande Village, along the Pinnacles Trail, and in the filtration pond at Chisos Basin Campground

Grace's Warbler Setophaga graciae – Several seen and heard, Davis Mountains TNC preserve

Townsend's Warbler D. townsendi—3 at Sam Nail Ranch

Wilson's Warbler Wilsonia pusilla—frequently encountered migrant warbler seen daily

Painted Redstart *Myioborus pictus* – 2 near Pinnacles while looking for Colima Warbler

Yellow-breasted Chat Icteria virens—several at Rio Grande Village, Sam Nail Ranch

Green-tailed Towhee Pipilo chlorurus—Ft. Davis, several at Christmas Mountains Oasis.

Spotted Towhee *P. maculatus*—Davis and Chisos Mountains

Canyon Towhee P. fuscus—common; seen almost daily

Rufous-crowned Sparrow Aimophila ruficeps—seen well in Davis Mountains, Christmas Mtns

Chipping Sparrow Spizella passerina—very common throughout

Clay-colored Sparrow S. pallida— 1seen at Balmorhea State Park in ranger's back yard

Brewer's Sparrow S. breweri—Christmas Mountains Oasis

Vesper Sparrow *Pooecetes gramineus*—Lake Balmorhea and at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Lark Sparrow *Chondestes grammacus*—a striking species, seen very well at Ft. Davis and Christmas Mountains Oasis

Black-throated Sparrow *Amphispiza bilineata*—a desert specialist, this dapper sparrow was seen at El Paso Archaeological Museum, and at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Song Sparrow *Melospiza melodia* – The Post, Marathon

Lincoln's Sparrow Melospiza lincolnii—only 2, at Sam Nail Ranch

White-crowned Sparrow *Zonotrichia leucophrys*—small groups at Balmorhea State Park, Lake, and at Sam Nail Ranch

Hepatic Tanager Piranga flava—several in Cottonwood Campground, Big Bend NP

Summer Tanager P. rubra—several in Davis Mountains State Park, Rio Grande Village

Northern Cardinal *Cardinalis*—a few at Balmorhea State Park, in the Davis Mountains, and in riparian areas throughout Big Bend's lower elevations

Pyrrhuloxia *C. sinuatus*—beautiful relative of the cardinal, seen at El Paso Archaeological Museum and at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Black-headed Grosbeak *Pheucticus melanocephalus*—regularly encountered in Davis Mountains and Big Bend NP

Blue Grosbeak Passerina caerulea— One seen well in grass at the Post

Varied Bunting P. versicolor—a gem, seen at Christmas Mountains Oasis and Chisos Campground

Painted Bunting P. ciris—Quick view of this stunning bird at Cottonwood Campground

Red-winged Blackbird *Agelaius phoeniceus*—a number seen at Balmorhea State Park and Lake Balmorhea

Eastern Meadowlark Sternella magna—individuals were heard around Chisos Basin Lodge

Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta – Seen and heard in Balmorhea and Davis Mountains

Yellow-headed Blackbird *Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus*—1 at Rio Grande Village; 1 at Gage Gardens, Marathon

Brewer's Blackbird Euphagus cyanocephalus— Common in Balmorhea, Gage Gardens

Great-tailed Grackle *Quiscalus mexicanus*—abundant in El Paso and Marathon

Brown-headed Cowbird Molothrus ater—Balmorhea State Park; lots at Gage Gardens, Marathon

Bullock's Oriole I. bullockii— Several at Balmorhea State Park near Great Horned Owl

Scott's Oriole *I. parisorum*—Seen well at Davis Mountains State Park, Rio Grande Village, Christmas Mountains

House Finch Carpodacus mexicanus—seen throughout

Pine Siskin Carduelis pinus—numerous at Davis and Christmas Mountains feeders;

Lesser Goldfinch C. psaltria—several at Balmorhea State Park, the Post, Christmas Mtns Oasis

House Sparrow Passer domesticus—common in towns throughout

Mammals

Desert Cottontail *Sylvilagus auduboni* – Lake Balmorhea State Park

Black-tailed Jackrabbit Lepus californicus – One near highway leading to Balmorhea State Park

Mexican Ground Squirrel Spermophilus mexicanus – Several at Balmorhea State Park

Rock Squirrel S. Variegatus – A few in colony above Chisos Basin Campground

Black-tailed Prairie Dog *Cynomys ludovicianus* – About a dozen seen in colony NE of Marathon

Collared Peccary (Javelina) Tayassu tajacu – Ten in Davis Mountains State Park at close range

White-tailed Deer O. virginianus – A few in the Davis Mountains

Mule Deer Odocoileus hemionus – About a dozen total in Davis Mountains

Pronghorn Antilocarpa Americana – One pair east of Marfa

Blotched Water Snake *Nerodia erythrogaster transversa* – 3 in water eating catfish at Balmorhea State Park

Rock Rattler Crotalus Lepidus – On rock along trail in Davis Mountains TNC preserve Western Coachwhip Mastocophis flagellum – At Santa Elena Canyon
Texas Spiny Soft Shell Turtle Apalone spinifera pallida – A few at Balmorhea State Park
Painted Turtle – Chrisemys picta – Balmorhea State Park

Comanche Pupfish Cyprinodon elegans – Balmorhea State Park Pecos Mosquitofish Gambusia nobilis – Balmorhea State Park Headwater Catfish Ictalurus lupus – Balmorhea State Park

Dragonflies

Roseate Skimmer *Libellula saturate* – In wet areas of Davis and Chisos Mountains **Blue-eyed Darner** *Rhionaeschna multicolor* – In ponds and backwaters of Big Bend NP

Amphibians

American Bull Frog Rana catasbeiana – Heard loudly at Rio Grande Village wetlands

Butterflies

Monarch *Danaus Plexippus* – Seen frequently throughout trip
