BIRDS

Gadwall Anas strepera— At McNary Reservoir

Blue-winged Teal Anas discors— 2 seen in same pond at Balmorhea State Park

Northern Shoveler Anas clypeata—at McNary Reservoir and in the Rio Grande River

Northern Pintail Anas acuta – 2 at McNary Reservoir

Lesser Scaup Aythya affini – One resting on bank of pond at Balmorhea State Park

Bufflehead Bucephala albeola – A pair at McNary Reservoir

Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis— Several in breeding plumage at McNary Reservoir

Scaled Quail *Callipepla squamata*— Coveys en route to and from Big Bend, Dugout Wells, Rio Grande Village and at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Pied-billed Grebe *Podilymbus podiceps*— Several at McNary Reservoir and in roadside pond between Ft. Davis and Alpine

Western Grebe Aechmophorus occidentalis—at least 2 at McNary Reservoir

Clark's Grebe *Aechmophorus clarkii*— Several at McNary Reservoir; 2 did part of elaborate courtship dance

Double-crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus* – Several over McNary Reservoir

Great Blue Heron *Ardea herodias*— One on Rio Grande River along nature center trail, constantly vocalizing as it hunted.

Snowy Egret Egretta thula— A few perched conspicuously at McNary Reservoir

Green Heron Butorides virescens— One hunting in water channel at Balmorhea State Park

White-faced Ibis Plegadis chihi – Two flocks flying low over McNary Reservoir

Black Vulture Coragyps atratus— Many – especially in Big Bend National Park

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura—Multiple daily sightings

Osprey Pandion haliaetis – Two soaring above Rio Grande Village

Northern Harrier Circus cyaneus— One on the first day flying over Chihuahuan desert

Common Black-Hawk *Buteogallus anthracinus*— One on cliffs north of Ft. Davis; another in protected nesting area near Rio Grande Village.

Gray Hawk Buteo nitidus— Excellent looks at 2 at Daniel's Ranch and one in Cottonwood Campground.

Swainson's Hawk *Buteo swainsoni*—One on drive from El Paso to Ft. Davis; another above Prairie Dog colony outside of Marathon.

Zone-tailed Hawk *Buteo albonotatus*—One that Rebecca found calling and soaring above Chisos Basin Campground

Red-tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis—seen throughout trip in small numbers.

Golden Eagle *Aquila chrysaetos* – Three soaring together over Davis Mountains Nature Conservancy preserve

American Kestrel Falco sparverius— One perched along highway west of Marfa

Sora Porzana carolina – One heard clearly along Rio Grande Village nature trail

American Coot Fulica americana—Several in McNary Reservoir and along Rio Grande River

Spotted Sandpiper *Actitis macularius* – One in pond at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis – Several at McNary Reservoir

Rock Pigeon Columba livia—In towns including El Paso, Ft. Davis, Alpine and Marathon

Eurasian Collared-Dove Streptopelia decaocto—In El Paso, Fort Davis and other urban areas

White-winged Dove Zenaida asiatica—common everywhere except in the high Chisos

Mourning Dove Zenaida macroura—seen most days except on the hike to Boot Springs

Inca Dove Columbina inca – Several spotted by Judy in Cottonwood Campground

Wild Turkey *Meleagris gallopavo*— One foraging alongside road on the way to Davis Mountains State Park

Greater Roadrunner *Geococcyx californianus*—these engaging characters were seen often – especially in Big Bend National Park, and in Rio Grande Village area particularly.

Great Horned Owl Bubo virginianus - Spotted by Gerhard in Cottonwood campground

Burrowing Owl Athene cunicularia— One seen at Prairie Dog town NE of Marathon

Lesser Nighthawk Chordeiles acutipennis – Several fly-catching over Dugout Wells at dusk

Common Poorwill Phalaenoptilus nuttallii – One on the road at night near Dugout Wells

White-throated Swift Aeronautes saxatalis— Many at Pinnacles Pass

Lucifer Hummingbird *Calothorax lucifer* – One well spotted by Tish and seen well by everyone in scope at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Black-chinned Hummingbird Archilochus alexandri— Most common hummingbird of journey

Broad-tailed Hummingbird *Selasphorus platycercus* – One at Boot Springs

Belted Kingfisher Ceryle alcyon – Seen at McNary Reservoir and again at Marathon Post

Acorn Woodpecker Melanerpes formicivorus—abundant in Davis and Chisos Mountains

Golden-fronted Woodpecker *Melanerpes aurifrons*—the common, conspicuous woodpecker at Rio Grande Village, Cottonwood Campground and the Marathon Post County Park

Ladder-backed Woodpecker Picoides scalaris— Common in parks and campgrounds visited

Eastern Phoebe Sayornis phoebe – Perched conspicuously at Rio Grande Village

Buff-breasted Flycatcher *Empidonax fulvifrons* – Two calling and seen well at TNC Davis Mountains preserve

Black Phoebe Sayornis nigricans – One at Marathon Post and one seen by Tish and Brendan in Santa Elena Canyon

Say's Phoebe Sayornis saya—seen almost daily; several nested on eaves at Chisos Basin Lodge

Vermilion Flycatcher *Pyrocephalus rubinus*—a favorite, these exquisite flycatchers were first spotted by Rebecca in the roadside pond between Ft. Davis and Alpine, and later seen frequently in Rio Grande Village, Cottonwood Campground & at the Post

Ash-throated Flycatcher *Myiarchus cinerascens*—several at Davis Mountains State Park and at Cottonwood Campground

Brown-crested Flycatcher *Myiarchus tyrannulus*—the large, showy flycatcher in Rio Grande Village **Cassin's Kingbird** *Tyrannus vociferans*—common in Davis Mountains

Western Kingbird Tyrannus verticalis—common and widespread, seen most days

Loggerhead Shrike Lanius Iudovicianus – Spotted by Kathleen along road between Ft. Davis and Alpine Bell's Vireo Vireo bellii— First seen at Limpia Canyon and then many more times at Rio Grande Village and elsewhere. Its buzzy song was a constant in Big Bend riparian zones

Hutton's Vireo Vireo huttoni – One seen in Boot Springs campground

Western Scrub-Jay Aphelocoma californica— Common in the Davis Mountains

Mexican Jay Aphelocoma ultramarina— Seen close-up and often in the Chisos Mountains

American Crow Corvus brachyrhynchos – Common in El Paso

Chihuahuan Raven Corvus cryptoleucus—Great looks at a pair west of Marfa

Common Raven *Corvus corax*—In the Davis and Chisos Mountains, with some in the lower regions

Tree Swallow Tachycineta bicolor – Several flying above McNary Reservoir

Violet-green Swallow *Tachycineta thalassina* – Seen at Balmorhea State Park and in the Davis Mountains

Northern Rough-winged Swallow *Stelgidopteryx serripennis*— A few at Limpia Canyon and er at Santa Elena Canyon

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica—Seen most days of trip, often nesting on buildings

Cliff Swallow Petrochelidon pyrrhonota – Abundant at Balmorhea State Park

Cave Swallow *Petrochelidon fulva*—A small colony at McNary Reservoir underpass on I-10; more at Van Horn overpass at the end of our journey

Black-crested Titmouse *Baeolophus atricristatus*—In the Davis Mountains at the TNC preserve and the state park; also in the Chisos Mountains

Verdin Auriparus flaviceps— Heard at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Bushtit *Psaltriparus minimus* – A few in the Davis Mountains

White-breasted Nuthatch *Sitta carolinensis*—One in the Davis Mountains at Madera Canyon trailhead roadside Park

Red-breasted Nuthatch Sitta canadensis – One in Boot Springs campground

Rock Wren *Salpinctes obsoletus*— Many encountered at Ft. Davis,in the Chisos Mountains, and in Santa Elena Canyon

Canyon Wren *Catherpes mexicanus*—Heard and seen in the Davis Mountains and on most days in Big Bend National Park at Chisos Basin, in the Pinnacles, and Santa Elena Canyon

Bewick's Wren Thryomanes bewickii—common in the Davis and Chisos Mountains

Cactus Wren *Campylorhynchus brunneicapillus*—Seen in Davis Mountains; also frequently heard and seen in Big Bend N.P., including family in Chisos Basin Lodge parking lot

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher Polioptila caerulea—Many along the trail to Boot Spring

Western Bluebird Sialia mexicana— Several seen well at Madera Canyon in Davis Mountains

Hermit Thrush Catharus guttatus – One seen in Boot Springs campground

American Robin Turdus migratorius— Seen on first day at Balmorhea State Park

Northern Mockingbird Mimus polyglottos—A conspicuous species, seen every day except two

Curve-billed Thrasher *Toxostoma curvirostre*—First seen well in Davis Mountains, then again at entrance to Big Bend N.P. (Panther Junction), and in Chisos Basin Campground

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris— Small groups in El Paso & Fort Davis

American Pipit *Anthus rubescens*— On shore of pond in TNC preserve, Davis Mountains, and along muddy shore of Rio Grande River

Cedar Waxwing Bombycilla cedrorum – One calling and perching at Rio Grande Village

Phainopepla *Phainopepla nitens*— Saw six of these elegant silky-flycatchers at Limpia Creek Primitive Area in the Davis Mountains

Colima Warbler *Vermivora crissalis*— Saw a total of six, including several just below (west) of Pinnacle Pass and the rest in Graves Oaks east to the Boot Springs campground

Common Yellowthroat *Geothlypis trichas*—Seen and heard at Rio Grande Village's wetlands **Yellow-rumped Warbler** Audubon's and Myrtle races *Dendroica coronata*—common in the Davis Mountains, Rio Grande Village, and at Cottonwood Campground

Townsend's Warbler *Dendroica townsendi*— A small flock on the Pinnacles Trail just west of pass **Wilson's Warbler** *Wilsonia pusilla*—One in Limpia Canyon Primitive area in the Davis Mountains and one at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Painted Redstart Myioborus pictus – One at Boot Springs

Yellow-breasted Chat *Icteria virens*—Several at Rio Grande Village calling frequently, plus others at Sam Nail Ranch that perched in plain view

Spotted Towhee Pipilo maculatus— Seen in the Chisos Mountains and on Boot Springs hike

Canyon Towhee Pipilo fuscus—Seen almost daily, including on our front porches at Chisos Basin

Rufous-crowned Sparrow Aimophila ruficeps — Spotted by Tish near Chisos Basin Campground

Chipping Sparrow Spizella passerina—Multiple individuals seen in Davis Mountains, in Chisos Basin and on Boot Springs hike

Brewer's Sparrow *Spizella breweri*—Seen and heard at Marfa Lights interpretive center **Vesper Sparrow** *Pooecestes gramineus* - One seen at Marfa Lights interpretive center

Black-throated Sparrow Amphispiza bilineata—A desert specialist, this dapper sparrow was seen in the Davis Mountains, on our last day in Big Bend N.P.

Lincoln's Sparrow *Melospiza lincolnii*— One at Balmorhea State Park, one at the Marathon Post, and one at Chisos Basin Campground – all spotted by Kathleen

White-crowned Sparrow *Zonotrichia leucophrys*— A flock in Limpia Canyon Primitive Area, Davis Mountains State Park

Hepatic Tanager *Piranga flava*— One just when we arrived in Cottonwood Campground

Summer Tanager *Piranga rubra*—Several in Davis Mountains State Park, and close-up views at Rio

Grande Village and at Cottonwood Campground

Northern Cardinal *Cardinalis* — Common in the Davis Mountains, and in riparian areas throughout Big Bend's lower elevations

Pyrrhuloxia Cardinalis sinuatus—Beautiful relative of the cardinal seen in the Davis Mountains and at Sam Nail Ranch in Big Bend NP

Black-headed Grosbeak *Pheucticus melanocephalus*—One found by Tish and seen well by all in Cottonwood Canyon

Blue Grosbeak Passerina caerulea— One seen well in grass at the Post

Varied Bunting *Passerina versicolor*—A gem, seen first at Sam Nail Ranch by Kathy; and later by all at Christmas Mountains Oasis

Red-winged Blackbird *Agelaius phoeniceus*—A number seen at roadside pond between Ft. Davis and Alpine

Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta – Seen along road between Big Bend NP and Marathon Great-tailed Grackle Quiscalus mexicanus—Abundant most days in towns and cities

Brown-headed Cowbird Molothrus ater—In Davis Mountains and at Sam Nail Ranch, Big Bend N.P.

Orchard Oriole Icterus spurius— One spotted by Kathleen at Cottonwood Campground

Scott's Oriole *Icterus parisorum*—Seen well at Chisos Basin Lodge and at Chisos Basin campground **House Finch** Carpodacus mexicanus—Seen throughout

Pine Siskin Carduelis pinus—Numerous at Davis Mountains State Park feeders;

Lesser Goldfinch *Carduelis psaltria*— At the Post, Davis Mountains and at Christmas Mountains Oasis **House Sparrow** *Passer domesticus*—Common in towns throughout

MAMMALS

Desert Cottontail Sylvilagus auduboni—Common in lower elevation desert habitat

Black-tailed Jack Rabbit Lepus californicus — One seen from highway in Big Bend N.P

Barbary Sheep (Introduced) Ovis canadensis nelsoni – Seven in several family groups on steep rock cliffs north of Ft. Davis alertly spotted by Judy

Rock Squirrel *Spermophilus variegatus*—Two upon entering Chisos Basin Lodge, and another at campground

Black-tailed Prairie Dog Cynomys Iudovicianus— Dozens seen in dog colonies near Marathon

White-tailed Deer Odocoileus virginianus—A half-dozen in Chisos Basin

Mule Deer Odocoileus hemionus – Several in the Davis Mountains

Pronghorn Antilocapra americana— 7 NE of Marathon in Prairie Dog town

Coyote Canis latrans - One on road at night upon returning from Dugout Wells, Big Bend NP

Rocky Mountain Elk (possibly from Glass Mountain herd?) *Cervis canadensis nelsoni* – One cow struggling to get through fenced- in areas NE of Marathon in Prairie Dog Colony vicinity

HERPS AND OTHER VERTEBRATES

Sagebrush Lizard Sceloporus graciosus – One at Davis Mountains TNC preserve

Big Bend Slider *Trachemys gaigeae*— Two basking on nature trail ponds, Rio Grande Village; others in cienega pond at Balmorhea State Park

Spiny Soft-shelled Turtle *Apolone spinifera* – Several swimming in cienega pond at Balmorhea State Park **Black-tailed Rattlesnake** *Crotalus molossus* – A large 4-foot specimen encountered by Lionel near Pinnacle Pass where the snake activated its rattles!

Western Coachwhip Snake (Red Racer) *Masticophis flagellum* – Wriggling rapidly to get off road between Study Butte and Christmas Mountains Oasis

AMPHIBIANS

Leopard Frog *Rana sphenocephala* – In Carolyn Ohl-Johnson's ponds at her home in Christmas Mountains oasis
