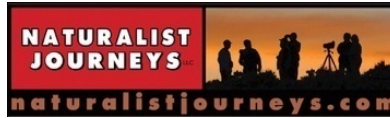


Colombia: Birding from Bogota July 22 –30, 2026 | Species List with Naturalist Journeys

Summary: This was a great trip to Bogota and nearby areas. The first part of the trip was north of Bogota in the Eastern Andes. We hit a variety of habitats from wetlands at La Florida to high elevation forests around Guasca. We then headed south of Bogota and visited Sumapaz National Park, which was rainy and cold, but provided some interesting species in the paramo. The last part of the trip was spent around Villavicencio in the warmer lowlands.

Following is a list of the mammals and reptiles we were fortunate to observe during the trip.

Mammals: (6)

Brazilian Guinea Pig *Cavia aperea* – we had quite a few along the trail at La Florida in Bogota

Capybara *Hydrochoerus hydrochaeris* – There were many around Hotel Aitabu in Villavicencio

Giant Anteater *Myrmecophaga tridactyla* – One seen while on a walk at El Silencio Reserve

Humboldt's Squirrel Monkey *Saimiri cassiquiarensis* – There were a couple at Hotel Aitabu

Brumback's Night Monkey *Aotus brumbacki* – We saw a few on the night walk near Hotel Aitabu

Gray-bellied Night Monkey *Aotus lenurinus* – We saw two at Casa Hildebrand on a walk
