

The Hummingbird Series: Ecuador!

This Hummingbird's trip explored a remarkable range of habitats around the Ecuadorian Andes, from montane forest to high elevation valleys and surrounding foothills. Besides Ecuador's exceptional diversity of hummingbirds, the trip also provided opportunities to observe a broad selection of the Andean bird species and even mammals!

BIRDS 354 species were recorded of which 10 were heard only and 01 were introduced. Details are included below.

Following is a list of the birds, mammals we were fortunate to observe during the trip.

MAMMALS (11):

Andean Tapeti *Sylvilagus andinus* — (x) seen around Termas de Papallacta.

Black Agouti *Dasyprocta fuliginosa* — (x) wondering around the moth trap at San Isidro Lodge.

South American Coati *Nasua nasua* — (x) climbing a Cecropia tree for bananas in Wildsumaco Lodge

Tayra *Eira barbara* — (x) same popular spot in wildsumaco lodge, bananas.

White-tailed Deer *Odocoileus virginianus* — (x) while driving the paved road in Antisana Ecological Reserve.

Red tailed Squirrel *Sciurus granatensis* — (x) in several areas where banana feeders for birds were set.

Central American Agouti *Dasyprocta punctata* — (x) a big group is used to corn feeders at Sachatamia Lodge.

Spectacled bear *Tremarctos ornatus* — (x) by the road entering Papallacta Pass area twice in different days but similar location.

Mountain Tapir *Tapirus pinchaque* — (x) a surprising sight from the deck in San Isidro Lodge right after dinner.

Dwarf Squirrel *Microsciurus flaviventer* — (x) a shy individual wandering around the moth trap of Amagusa Reserve.

Napo/ Graells's Tamarin *Saguinus graellsii* — (x) a noisy group by the road after the antpitta trail excursion in Wildsumaco.
