BIRDS 251 species found:

DUCKS, GEESE and SWANS: Anatidae (2)

Muscovy Duck *Cairina moschata* – Seen in river at Las Acacias Restaurant

Blue-winged Teal *Anas discors* – Three seen at “KM4” on the way to Minca

CHACHALACAS, GUANS, and CURRASOWS: Cracidae (5)

Chestnut-winged Chachalaca (E) *Ortalis garrula* – Many seen and heard at Atlantico University, Barranquilla

Rufous-vented Chachalaca (ShE) *Ortalis ruficaudarusuficrissa* – Six seen and heard at the Tollbooth Area on the way to La Guajira

Band-tailed Guan *Penelope argyrotis colombiana* – Seen multiples days and places, including the Scientific Station at San Lorenzo and El Dorado Lodge

Crested Guan *Penelope purpurascens* – Seen at El Dorado Lodge

Sickle-winged Guan (E) *Chamaepetes goudotii sanctaemarthae* – Two seen at El Dorado Lodge

NEW WORLD QUAIL: Odontophoridae (1)

Crested Bobwhite (ShE) *Colinus cristatus cristatus* – A family of fourteen seen at Camarones

FLAMINGOS: Phoenicopteridae (1)

American Flamingo *Phoenicopterus ruber* – Three seen at pond “KM4” on the road to Minca

FRIGATEBIRDS: Fregatidae (1)

Magnificent Frigatebird *Fregata magnificens* – Seen at multiple locations including Tasajera and Camarones

CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae: (1)

Neotropic Cormorant *Phalacrocorax brasilianus brasilianus* – Seen at “KM4” and Tasajera

PELICANS: Pelecanidae (1)

Brown Pelican *Pelecanus occidentalis* – One seen at Tasajera

HERONS and EGRETS: Ardeidae (8)

Great Blue Heron *Ardea herodias* – One seen at “KM4” area

Great Egret *Ardea alb egretta* – A dozen or so seen at Tasajera on the first day and then dozens seen as we traveled back to Barranquilla from Tasajera on our last day.

Snowy Egret *Egretta thula thula* – Many, many seen at Tasajera

Little Blue Heron *Egretta caerulea* – A few seen at Las Acacias and then again at Tasajera

Tricolored Heron *Egretta tricolor ruficollis* – Two seen at “KM4” area

Cattle Egret *Bubulcus ibis coromandus* – Seen at “KM4” and La Guajira

Green Heron *Butorides virescens virescens* – One seen at Isla Salamanca

Yellow-crowned Night-Heron *Nyctanassa violacea cayennensis* – One seen at Tasajera

IBIS: Threskiornithidae (2)

Glossy Ibis *Plegadis falcinellus* – One seen at “KM4”

Bare-faced Ibis *Phimosus infuscatus berlepschi* – Approximately 350 seen flying at “the Cowbird Stop” on Day One and then another couple seen at Isla Salamanca on our last day

NEW WORLD VULTURES: Cathartidae (4)

King Vulture *Sarcoramphus papa* – Great look at soaring vulture, lit by the sun, at the “Oropendola Stop”

Black Vulture *Coragyps atratus* – Many, many seen at multiple sites on multiple days

Turkey Vulture (Tropical) *Cathartes aura ruficollis* – Many, many seen at multiple sites on multiple days

Lesser Yellow-headed Vulture *Cathartes burrovianus* – First seen at “KM4”

OSPREY: Pandionidae (1)

Osprey *Pandion haliaetus carolinensis* – One seen at Tasajera

HAWKS, KITES and EAGLES: Accipitridae (9)

Pearl Kite *Gampsonyx swainsonii* – Seen at Huayuu Village at Camarones

Snail Kite *Rostrhaus sociabilis sociabilis* – Six or so seen at “KM4” area on the first day and then one seen at Isla Salamanca

Plumbeous Kite *Ictinia plumbea* – Seen at our lunch stop at El Campano

Sharp-shinned Hawk (Plain-breasted) *Accipiter striatus ventralis* – One seen while birding below El Dorado Lodge

Cooper’s Hawk *Accipiter cooperii* – A couple of folks saw one along Las Gaviotas Road

Bicolored Hawk *Accipiter bicolor bicolor* – One seen flying while heading to Finca Palo Alto, below El Dorado Lodge

Savanna Hawk *Buteogallus meridionalis* – One seen at “KM4” area

Grey-lined Hawk *Buteo nitidus blakei* – One seen next to nest at Quinta San Pedro Alejandrino Museum

Zone-tailed Hawk *Buteo albonotatus* – Seen at La Cabaña Road and again at Isla Salamanca

RAILS and ALLIES: Rallidae (2)

Sora *Porzana carolina* – (HO) At “KM4” area, heard multiple times but never seen

Purple Gallinule *Porphyrio martinica* – Seen on first day at “KM4” and on last day at Isla Salamanca

LIMPKIN: Aramidae (1)

Limpkin (Brown-backed) *Aramus guarauna* – One seen at “KM4”

STILTS and AVOCETS: Recurvirostridae (1)

Black-necked Stilt *Himantopus mexicanus mexicanus* – Three seen at “KM4”

PLOVERS and LAPWINGS: Charadriidae (2)

Southern Lapwing *Vanellus chilensis cayennensis* – Three seen at “KM4”

Black-bellied Plover *Pluvialis squatarola* – Four seen on our last day at Tasajera

THICK-KNEES: Burhinidae (1)

Double-striped Thick-knee *Burhinus bistriatus pediacus* – Three seen in a field along the road while traveling back from La Guajira

JACANAS: Jacanidae (1)

Wattled Jacana (Black-backed) *Jacana jacana hypomelaena* – Seen at “KM4” area and then again at Isla Salamanca

SANDPIPERS and ALLIES: Scolopacidae (5)

Baird’s Sandpiper *Calidris bairdii* – One seen at Tasajera

Least Sandpiper *Calidris minutilla* – Three seen at Camarones – Los Flamencos Road

Greater Yellowlegs *Tringa melanoleuca* – One seen along the river at Las Acacias and then seen again at Tasajera

Willet (Eastern) *Tringa semipalmata semipalmata* – One seen at Tasajera

Lesser Yellowlegs *Tringa flavipes* – Seen at “KM4” and then again at Tasajera

GULLS, TERNS and SKIMMERS: Laridae (3)

Laughing Gull *Leucophaeus atricilla megalopterus* – Three seen at Tasajera

Royal Tern (American) *Thalasseus maximus maximus* – Two seen at Tasajera on our first day and then a dozen or so seen there again on our last day

Elegant Tern *Thalasseus elegans* – Three seen on our last day at Tasajera

PIGEONS and DOVES: Columbidae (9)

Rock Pigeon *Columba livia* – Many, many seen throughout the trip at multiple locations

Pale-vented Pigeon *Patagioenas cayennensis* – One seen Atlantico Universidad

Bare-eyed Pigeon *Patagioenas corensis* – More than 100 seen at the tollbooth stop on the way to La Guajira

Band-tailed Pigeon (White-necked) *Patagioenas fasciata albilinea* – Seen on Kennedy Hill and also at El Dorado Lodge

Common Ground-dove *Columbina passerine albivitta* – Five seen at “the Cowbird Stop”

Ruddy Ground Dove *Columbina talpacoti rufipennis* – Seen multiple days at both Atlantico Universidad and at the Don Diego River stop

Scaled Dove *Columbina squammata ridgwayi* – Seen at “the Cowbird Stop” and again at Isla Salamanca

White-tipped Dove *Leptotila verreauxi verreauxi* – A number seen at multiple locations including the “Antpitta Stop”, El Dorado Lodge, La Cabaña and Isla Salamanca

Eared Dove *Zenaida auriculata stenura* – One seen at “KM4” area

CUCKOOS and ALLIES: Cuculidae (2)

Smooth-billed Ani *Crotophaga ani* – Two seen at Isla Salamanca

Squirrel Cuckoo (Amazonian) *Piaya cayana mehleri* – Seen multiple times including at La Cabaña, Villa Maria and Las Gaviotas Road

OWLS: Strigidae (2)

Santa Marta Screech Owl (E) *Megascops gilesi* (HO) – Heard at the San Lorenzo Scientific Station

Ferruginous Pygmy-Owl *Glaucidium brasilianum medianum* (HO) – Heard at multiple locations including Minca, Las Gaviotas Road and Atlantico Universidad

SWIFTS: Apodidae (1)

White-collared Swift *Streptoprocne zonaris subtropicalis* – Quite a few seen at Minca and again below El Dorado Lodge

HUMMINGBIRDS: Trochilidae (22)

White-necked Jacobin *Florisuga mellivora mellivora* – Many seen frequently at La Minca Casona feeders and Villa Maria feeders

Rufous-breasted Hermit *Glaucis hirsutus hirsutus* – Seen at Villa Maria feeders

Long-billed Hermit (Central American) *Phaethornis longirostris susurrus* – Seen multiple times at La Minca Casona feeders and at the “1500M stop”

Brown Violetear *Colibri delphinae* – Seen often at El Dorado Lodge feeders

Lesser Violetear (Andean) *Colibri cyanotuscyanotus/crissalis* – Many seen at El Dorado Lodge feeders and at Finca Palo Alto

Sparkling Violetear *Colibri coruscans* – Many seen at El Dorado Lodge feeders and at Finca Palo Alto

Black-throated Mango *Anthracothorax nigricollis* – One seen at Villa Maria feeders

Santa Marta Blossomcrown (E) *Anthocephala floriceps* – Seen at flowering trees at Finca Palo Alto

Black-backed Thornbill (E) *Ramphomicron dorsale* – Seen at Kennedy Hill

Tyrian Metaltail (Santa Marta) (ShE) *Metallura tyrianthina districta* – Seen at Kennedy Hill and along the road above El Dorado Lodge

White-tailed Starfrontlet (E) *Coeligena phalerata* – Seen at Kennedy Hill

Santa Marta Woodstar (E) *Chaetocercus astreans* – Seen at flowering trees at Finca Palo Alto

Red-billed Emerald (E) *Chlorostilbon gibsoni chrysogaster* – Seen at La Minca Casona feeders and at Atlantico Universidad

Coppery Emerald (E) *Chlorostilbon russatus* – Seen at the “1200M Hummer Stop”

White-vented Plumeleteer (ShE) *Chalybura buffoniiaeneicauda* – Seen at La Minca Casona feeders

Crowned Woodnymph (Colombian Violet-crowned) (ShE) *Thalurania colombica columbica* – Many, many seen at El Dorado Lodge feeders and at Villa Maria feeders

Buffy Hummingbird *Leucippus fallax* – Two seen at Huayuu Village, Camarones

Rufous-tailed Hummingbird (ShE) *Amazilia tzacatl fuscicaudata* – Seen at multiple locations including La Minca Casona feeders, Villa Maria feeders and Las Acacias

Sapphire-throated Hummingbird (E) *Lepidopyga coeruleogularis coelina* – Seen at Isla Salamanca National Park

Sapphire-bellied Hummingbird (E) *Lepidopyga lilliae* – Seen at Isla Salamanca National Park

Shining-green Hummingbird *Lepidopyga goudoti* – Seen on our last day Atlantico Universidad

White-chinned Sapphire (Blue-throated Golden) *Hylocharis cyanus viridiventris* – At Taironaka Trail lunch stop in trees between town and river

TROGONS: Trogonidae (2)

White-tipped Quetzal *Pharomachrus fulgidus festatus* – Multiple views at San Lorenzo Scientific Station

Masked Trogon (E) *Trogon personatus sanctaemartae* – Seen on multiple days at El Dorado Lodge and the road below the lodge as well

MOTMOTS: Momotidae (1)

Whooping Motmot *Momotus subrufescens subrufescens* – Seen on our first day and again on our last day at Atlantico Universidad

KINGFISHERS: Alcedinidae (1)

Ringed Kingfisher (Northern) *Megaceryle torquata torquata* – Seen at Atlantico Universidad and at Tasajera

PUFFBIRDS: Bucconidae (1)

Russet-throated Puffbird (ShE) *Hypnelus ruficollis ruficollis* – Five seen on our first day at Atlantico Universidad and again at “KM4”

Hypnelus ruficollis decolor – Pair seen at Camarones

JACAMARS: Galbulidae (1)

Rufous-tailed Jacamar (ShE) *Galbula ruficauda brevirostris* (HO) – Heard only at Camarones

TOUCANS: Ramphastidae (4)

Southern Emerald (Santa Marta) Toucanet (E) *Aulacorhynchus prasinus lautus* (HO) – Seen at San Lorenzo Scientific Station and again at the road above and below El Dorado Lodge

Groove-billed Toucanet (Yellow-billed) (ShE) *Aulacorhynchus sulcatus calorhynchus* – Four seen at the “1700M Stop” on the road from El Dorado to El Campano

Collared Aracari (ShE) *Pteroglossus torquatus nuchalis* – Seen at our lunch stop at Taironaka Trail along the Don Diego River

Keel-billed Toucan *Ramphastos sulfuratus brevicarinatus* – Seen at La Minca Casona and then also along the road below El Dorado Lodge

WOODPECKERS: Picidae (5)

Scaled Piculet (ShE) *Picumnus squamulatus lovejoyi* – One seen at a nest at the “Piculet Stop” along the road from Minca to El Dorado

Chestnut Piculet (E) *Picumnus cinnamomeus cinnamomeus* (HO) – Heard at Isla Salamanca National Park and again at Atlantico Universidad

Red-crowned Woodpecker *Melanerpes rubricapillus rubricapillus* – A few seen at “KM4”, then days later at Villa Maria, then the “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira and finally at Atlantico Universidad

Crimson-crested Woodpecker (ShE) *Campephilus melanoleucos malherbii* – First seen at Atlantico Universidad and then days later at La Cabaña

Lineated Woodpecker *Dryocopus lineatus lineatus* (HO drumming) – Heard along the road to Palo Alto

FALCONS and CARACARAS: Falconidae (3)

Crested Caracara *Caracara cheriway cheriway* – Many seen at close range at San Pedro Alejandrino Museum

Yellow-headed Caracara *Milvago chiimachima cordata* – Many seen on multiple days including Atlantico Universidad, “KM4”, and Isla Salamanca

American Kestrel (South American) *Falco sparverius isabellinus* – Seen at the “1700M Stop” between El Dorado and El Campano

PARROTS: Psittacidae (11)

Orange-chinned Parakeet *Brotogeris jugularis jugularis* – Many seen at multiple locations including Villa Maria, Taironaka and Isla Salamanca

Red-billed Parrot *Pionus sordidus saturatus* – Many seen at El Dorado

Blue-headed Parrot *Pionus menstruus rubrigularis* – Seen on multiple days along the road below Minca and at La Cabaña

Yellow-crowned Parrot *Amazona ochrocephala panamensis* – Seen at Atlantico Universidad and along the road below Minca

Scaly-naped Parrot *Amazona mercenarier canapalliata* – (HO) Heard at San Lorenzo Scientific Station

Green-rumped Parrotlet *Forpus passerines cyanophanes* – Many seen at dawn at the “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira

Santa Marta Parakeet (E) *Pyrrhura viridicata* – Many seen at dawn at Kennedy Hill

Brown-throated Parakeet *Eupsittula pertinax aeruginosa* – Many seen at Atlantico Universidad on our first and last day and also at “KM4” area

Military Macaw *Ara militaris militaris* – Many seen on the road below Minca and then heard only at our lunch stop along the Don Diego River

Orange-winged Parrot *Amazona amazonica* – Seen in the trees outside the entrance to San Pedro Alejandrino Museum

Scarlet-fronted Parakeet *Psittacara wagleri wagleri* – Seen on multiple days along the road below Minca, at Kennedy Hill and at San Lorenzo Scientific Station

ANTBIRDS: Thamnophilidae (3)

Black-crested Antshrike (Streak-fronted) (ShE) *Sakesphorus canadensis pulchellus* – Seen at Camarones and again at Atlantico Universidad

White-fringed Antwren (Northern) *Formivivora grisea inetermedia* – One seen at Camarones

Santa Marta Antbird (E) *Drymophila hellmayri* (HO) – These were heard on a “flyby”

ANTPITTAS: Grallariidae (2)

Santa Marta Antpitta (E) *Grallaria bangsi* (HO) – Heard at San Lorenzo Scientific Station

Rusty-breasted Antpitta (ShE) *Grallaria ferrugineipectus ferrugineipectus* – One seen at the “Antpitta Stop” at 1500M on the way between Minca and El Dorado. One seen at the “1700M Stop” on the road between El Dorado and El Campano

TAPACULOS: Rhinocryptidae (2)

Santa Marta Tapaculo (E) *Scytalopus sanctaemartae* (HO) – Heard on the road below Minca

Brown-rumped Tapaculo (E) *Scytalopus latebricola* (HO) – Heard only

OVENBIRDS and WOODCREEPERS: Furnariidae (12)

Gray-throated Leaf-tosser (E) *Sclerurus aligularis propinquus* – Seen “tossing” on the road below El Dorado Lodge

Strong-billed Woodcreeper (Andean/Northern) (E) *Xiphocolaptes promerophirhynchus sanctamartae* – Seen at El Dorado Lodge and again on the road below the lodge

Straight-billed Woodcreeper (ShE) *Dendroplex picus picirostris* – Seen along Las Gaviotas Road

Streak-headed Woodcreeper *Lepidocolaptes souleyetii littoralis* – One seen while we were hoping for the Piculet to return to its nest

Montane Woodcreeper (E) *Lepidocolaptes lacrymiger sanctaemartae* – Four seen at Kennedy Hill and another one seen on the road above El Dorado Lodge

Montane Foliage-gleaner (E) *Anabacerthia striaticollis anxia* – One seen on the road above El Dorado Lodge and the next day at the “1500M Stop” on the road between El Dorado and El Campano

Santa Marta Foliage-gleaner (E) *Clibanornis rufipectus* – Seen at the “1500M Stop” on the road between El Dorado and El Campano

Streak-capped Spinetail (E) *Cranioleuca hellmayri* – Two seen on Kennedy Hill

Yellow-chinned Spinetail (E) *Certhiaxis cinnamomeus fuscifrons* – Seen at “KM4” area and then heard only on our last day

Pale-breasted Spinetail (ShE) *Synallaxis albescens nesiotis* – One seen at the “Antpitta Stop” at 1500M along the road to El Dorado Lodge

White-whiskered Spinetail (ShE) *Synallaxis candei venezuelensis* – Two seen at Camarones

Rusty-headed Spinetail (E) *Synallaxis fuscorufa* – Six seen at Kennedy Hill

TYRANT FLYCATCHERS: Tyrannidae (30)

Southern Beardless Tyrannulet *Camptostoma obsoletum pusillum* – Seen at L Cabaña and also at Atlantico Universidad

White-throated Tyrannulet (ShE) *Mecocerculus leucophrys nigriceps* – About 20 seen at Kennedy and San Lorenzo Scientific Station

Yellow-bellied Elaenia *Elaenia flavogaster flavogaster* – Really good look at Isla Salamanca National Park

Olive-striped Flycatcher (E) *Mionectes olivaceus galbinus* – Seen on the road down from Finca Palo Alto

Sierran Elaenia *Elaenia pallatangae* – Seen on the road above El Dorado Lodge

Black-capped Tyrannulet (E) *Phyllomyias nigrocapillus flavimentum* – Seen at Kennedy Hill

Northern Scrub-Flycatcher (ShE) *Sublegatus arenarum atrirostris* – Seen at Huayuu Village at Camarones

Spectacled Tyrannulet (Paltry/Venezuelan) (E) *Zimmerius improbus tamae* – Seen on the road below El Dorado Lodge

Slender-billed Tyrannulet *Inezia tenuirostris* – Seen at Huayuu Village at Camarones

Common Tody-Flycatcher *Todirostrum cinereum cinereum* – Two seen at “KM4” area

Cinnamon Flycatcher (Santa Marta) (E) *Pyrrhomyias cinnamomeus assimilis* – Seen at hotspot at “1500M Stop” on road between El Dorado and El Campano

Willow Flycatcher (Eastern) *Empidonax Traillii traillii* – Seen at “Oropendola Stop”

Vermilion Flycatcher *Pyrocephalus rubinus saturates* – Seen at “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira

Pearly-vented Tody-Tyrant *Hemitriccus margaritaceiventer* – Two seen at Camarones

Black-throated Tody-Tyrant *Hemitriccus granadensis* – One seen at El Dorado Lodge

Santa Marta Bush-Tyrant (E) *Myiotheretes pernix* (HO) – Two heard on Kennedy Hill
Pied Water Tyrant *Fluvicola pica* – Seen at “KM4”
White-headed Marsh Tyrant *Arundinicola leucocephala* – Two seen in reeds at “KM4” area
Cattle Tyrant *Machetornis rixosa flavigulans* – Seen at Atlantico Universidad and at Isla Salamanca National Park
Bright-rumped Attila (Northern) (ShE) *Attila spadiceus parvirostris* (HO) – Heard on the road below Finca Palo Alto
Brown-crested Flycatcher (South American) *Myiarchus tyrannulus tyrannulus* – Seen at Las Gaviotas and Atlantico Universidad
Great Kiskadee *Pitangus sulphuratus rufipennis* – Seen in multiple locations including Atlantico Universidad and at the “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira
Boat-billed Flycatcher (South American) *Megarynchus pitangua pitangua* – Seen on the road below Minca, at Villa Maria and at Las Gaviotas
Social Flycatcher *Myiozetetes similis columbianus* – Many seen at multiple locations on multiple days including the “Oropendola Stop”, Taironaka Trail along the Don Diego River, the lunch stop at Las Acacias and Atlantico Universidad
Streaked Flycatcher (E) *Myiodynastes maculatus nobilis* – Seen along the road below Minca and at Villa Maria
Piratic Flycatcher *Legatus leucophaeus leucophaeus* – One seen at the “Oropendola Stop”
Tropical Kingbird *Tyrannus melancholicus satrapa* – Many seen on multiple days at multiples sites including Atlantico Universidad, “KM4” and the road below El Dorado
Eastern Kingbird *Tyrannus tyrannus* – One seen at “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira
Gray Kingbird *Tyrannus dominicensis dominicensis* – One seen at “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira and one seen at Isla Salamanca National Park
Fork-tailed Flycatcher (E) *Tyrannus savanna sancatemartae* – Two seen at “Tollbooth Stop” at La Guajira

COTINGAS: Cotingidae (1)

Golden-breasted Fruiteater (E) *Pipreola aureopectus decora* – Seen at San Lorenzo Scientific Station and at El Dorado Lodge

MANAKINS: Pipridae (2)

Lance-tailed Manakin *Chiroxiphia lanceolata* – Two seen at Las Gaviotas
White-bearded Manakin *Manacus manacus* – Female seen at La Cabaña

BECARDS and TITYRAS: Tityridae (1)

Masked Tityra *Tityra semifasciata columbiana* – Male and female seen at “Oropendola Stop”

VIREOS: Vireonidae (3)

Scrub Greenlet (E) *Hylophilus flavipes flavipes* – One seen on our last day at Atlantico Universidad
Brown-capped Vireo *Vireo leucophrys* – Seen along road above El Dorado Lodge and at “1500M Stop”
Red-eyed Vireo *Vireo olivaceus* – Seen at El Campano, at “1500M Stop”, and at Villa Maria

CROWS and JAYS: Corvidae (1)

Black-chested Jay (ShE) *Cyanocroax affinis affinis* – Seen at multiple locations on multiple days including the road below Minca and at El Dorado Lodge

SWALLOWS and MARTINS: Hirundinidae (4)

Blue-and-White Swallow *Pygochelidon cyanoleuca cyanoleuca* –
Southern Rough-winged Swallow *Stelgidopteryx ruficollis aequalis* – Seen on 3 different days at La Cabaña, Taironaka lunch stop at Don Diego River and at lunch stop at Las Acacias
Gray-breasted Martin *Progne chalybea chalybea* – Seen in downtown Santa Marta from rooftop at Casa Leda
Brown-chested Martin *Progne tapera tapera* – Seen in downtown Santa Marta from rooftop at Casa Leda

Troglodytidae: Wrens (7)
