Canada Goose: flooded field on drive to Torrey, UT and fly over on Hwy 15 on return to Salt Lake City Mallard: flooded field on drive to Torrey; Boulder Mountain pond Blue-winged Teal: Flooded field in Torrey, UT; pond west of Tropic Redhead: Flooded field on drive to Torrey, UT Ruddy Duck: Pond on drive to Lake Powell near Long Valley Gambel's Quail: Seen by Alistair behind Torrey Best Western, heard by Pat Dusky Grouse: Seen by Alistair behind Best Western Torrey, UT Wild Turkey: seen by all in fields near entrance to Zion NP **Pied-billed Grebe:** Flooded field on drive to Torrey, pond near Long Valley Western Grebe: seen by most in flooded field on drive to Torrey American White Pelican: seen in scope in flooded field on drive to Torrey and in Utah Lake on return to Salt Lake City Double-crested Cormorant: drive on highway in tree near Utah Lake and flying on Lake Powell on boat trip Great Blue Heron: flooded field on drive to Torrey White-faced Ibis: sighted by Stuart, seen flying from Hwy 15 before Nephi **Turkey Vulture:** seen every day in all locations California Condor: Two at Hobi Point, one seen in the scope by all sitting on a cliff, two flying nearby; two seen later in the day from the Rim Trail, Grand Canyon Osprey: Seen on return drive to SLC along Hwy 15 Northern Harrier: one spotted by Cathy at Lipon Point, one seen later on drive to Navaho Bridge Sharp-shinned Hawk: soaring over Larb Hollow Overlook on drive to Boulder and at Mohave Point Cooper's Hawk: Seen numerous locations soaring including Larb Hollow Overlook & Rim trails at Bryce Canyon & Grand Canyon **Red-tailed Hawk:** numerous sightings sitting on poles & soaring including a *Harlan's Hawk* variety on Hwy 24 on drive to Torrey Golden Eagle: near flooded field on Hwy 24 to Torrey, over Bryce Canyon, and 2 seen by all at close range at Grafton Cemetery

American Kestrel: numerous seen by all on drives to most locations Peregrine Falcon: nesting pair seen on cliffs from Rim trail, Grand Canyon Prairie Falcon: seen at Lipon Point at close range American Coot: seen by all in flooded field on drive to Torrey, Boulder Mountain pond, pond near Long Valley Killdeer: 2 seen by all in cow field in Ruby's Inn American Avocet: last day at motel area pond Solitary Sandpiper: flooded field in Torrey, UT Greater Yellowlegs: flock flying over motel pond in Salt Lake City seen by Pat & Wynne Franklin's Gull: flock seen flying over motel pond in SLC Ring-billed Gull: seen at the beginning and end of the trip at the motel pond in SLC **California Gull:** seen at the beginning and end of the trip at the motel pond in SLC **Rock Pigeon:** seen at numerous locations during the trip Band-tailed Pigeon: one flew over the van near Long Valley Eurasian Collared Dove: numerous sightings in many locations Mourning Dove: motel pond in SLC and town of Torrey, UT White-throated Swift: Larb Hollow overlook; Rim trail GC; Zion Overlook trail Black-chinned Hummingbird: seen by all at Calf Creek Falls NM feeders Costa's Hummingbird: seen by all at Calf Creek Falls feeders **Calliope Hummingbird:** feeders at Red Rim Restaurant across from Best Western Torrey & feeders at Calf Creek Falls Broad-tailed Hummingbird: feeders at restaurant & Calf Creek Falls Rufous Hummingbird: feeders at restaurant, Calf Creek Falls, Grand Canyon Belted Kingfisher: at least two seen on river at Calf Creek Falls Williamson's Sapsucker: pair seen on morning walk to Maswik Lodge, GC Red-naped Sapsucker: seen by many at Fruita orchards, Capitol Reef Ladder-backed Woodpecker: seen from Zion bus Hairy Woodpecker: seen on morning walk to Maswik Lodge & GC Rim trail **Red-shafted Flicker:** seen by all many times including Fruita Western Wood-Pewee: seen in scope in field at Fruita Hammond's Flycatcher: seen in orchard in Fruita Say's Phoebe: seen by all on roof of Best Western, Torrey & in field behind motel Vermillion Flycatcher: seen by all at Grafton in a field Ash-throated Flycatcher: seen in field behind Best Western Torrey Loggerhead Shrike: two seen on barbed wire on drive to Lake Powell near Long Valley Gray Vireo: seen in orchard in Fruita Warbling Vireo: seen on morning walk at Mossy Creek trail **Steller's Jay:** seen numerous locations, the first time at Larb Hollow overlook Western Scrub-Jay: seen frequently at Grand Canyon, first time on morning walk to Maswik Lodge **Pinyon Jay:** flocks seen 4 times including Chimney Rock overlook, Capitol Reef; Mossy Cave trail; Boulder Mountain pond, scenic overlooks Clark's Nutcracker: first 2 at Lark Hollow Overlook in scope; Bryce Canyon Rim Trail Black-billed Magpie: first seen at flooded field on drive to Torrey; cow pasture in Torrey; numerous other locations **American Crow:** along Hwy 15 on return drive to Salt Lake City **Common Raven:** seen everywhere Naturalist Journeys, LLC PO Box 16545 Portal, AZ 85632 PH: 520.558.1146 Toll free 866.900.1146 Fax 650.471.7667

Barn Swallow: motel pond in SLC; pond on drive to Lake Powell near Long Valley
Mountain Chickadee: seen well by all; first time at Larb Hollow overlook; Grand Canyon; many other locations

Juniper Titmouse: seen by Pat at Mossy Trail; seen well by many at Desert View, Grand Canyon Bushtit: flock at Lipon Point parking area

White-breasted Nuthatch: seen by all on Rim trail, Grand Canyon

Pygmy Nuthatch: first seen by all at Larb Hollow; many on Rim Trail, GC

Brown Creeper: seen by Pat on Rim trail, Grand Canyon

Rock Wren: seen by all from 5' at Chimney Rock lookout, Capitol Reef

Canyon Wren: one seen on Lake Powell, 2 seen at Marble Canyon

Pacific Wren: heard and seen by Pat at Larb Hollow Overlook

American Dipper: found by Stuart, seen by all, in river at Calf Creek Falls NM

Ruby-crowned Kinglet: 4 seen at Bryce Canyon Lodge

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher: flock seen at the top of Zion Overlook trail

Western Bluebird: many seen in scope in field outside Tropic, around Grand Canyon and numerous locations

Mountain Bluebird: first seen on Hwy 24 on drive to Torrey; seen by all at many other locations **Townsend's Solitaire:** seen and heard singing by all upon arrival at BryceCanyon Rim Trail

American Robin: seen by all at many locations

European Starling: yes

Orange-crowned Warbler: seen in trees along Fremont River in Fruita

Nashville Warbler: trail along Fremont River in Fruita; found by Stuart on sidewalk after window strike, Tropic hotel

Yellow-rumped (Audubon's) Warbler: Hwy 24 to Torrey; Rim trail Grand Canyon

Black-throated Gray Warbler: by all on morning walk along Rim trail, GC

Townsend's Warbler: morning walk along Rim trail, Grand Canyon

Grace's Warbler: area around Bryce Canyon Lodge

Wilson's Warbler: seen by Pat along river at Calf Creek Falls

Abert's Towhee: seen by Alistair behind Best Western Torrey

Chipping Sparrow: Fruita orchards and other locations

Clay-colored Sparrow: Fruita orchards & Grafton field

Savannah Sparrow: field by flooded area on road to Torrey

Song Sparrow: 2 in wet field on Riverside Trail, Zion NP

Lincoln's Sparrow: 4-5 in field in Grafton

White-crowned Sparrow: campground at Lake Powell, field at Grafton

Dark-eyed Junco (Gray-headed race): first seen by Wynne on drive at Bryce Canyon; Desert View, GC; Rim Trail, GC

Summer Tanager: female, Fruita; male, Zion Visitor's Center

Western Tanager: male seen by all at Fruita; females Grafton orchard

Black-headed Grosbeak: males & females, orchard at Fruita; male orchard at Grafton

Western Meadowlark: flooded field on drive to Torrey; agricultural field outside Tropic in scope; drive on Hwy 15 to SLC

Yellow-headed Blackbird: on Hwy 24 on drive to Torrey; great looks in cow pen in Ruby's Inn, seen by all in great light!

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Brewer's Blackbird: cow pen at Ruby's Inn, Bryce Canyon; mule yard on walk to Maswik Lodge, Grand Canyon
Great-tailed Grackle: city parking lot in Page to take Antelope Canyon truck
Brown-headed Cowbird: mule yard on walk to Maswik Lodge
Cassin's Finch: campground at Fruita
House Finch: many seen in orchard in Grafton and other places
Pine Siskin: on telephone wire at Boulder Mountain Lodge
Lesser Goldfinch: seen almost every day everywhere
House Sparrow: at every gas station
