BIRD SPECIES

Greater White-fronted Goose Anser albifrons –Large flock at Koosharem Reservoir, Hwy 24 Canada Goose Branta canadensis –Hundreds on shore at Koosharem Reservoir, Hwy 24 Mallard Anas platyrhynchos-Many locations including motel ponds, Koosharem Reservoir Blue-winged Teal Anas discors – Seen at Koosharem Reservoir Cinnamon Teal Anas cyanoptera-Seen at Koosharem Reservoir Redhead Aythya americana-Two at Koosharem Reservoir Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis-In breeding plumage at Koosharem Reservoir, flying at Lake Powell Wild Turkey Meleagris gallopavo-Large flock at Fruita, on drive to Page on Hwy 89, Grafton Pied-billed Grebe Podilymbus podiceps-Seen at Koosharem Reservoir & Ruby's pond Eared Grebe Podiceps nigricollis-In breeding plumage at Koosharem Reservoir, flocks on Lake Powell Western Grebe Aechmophorus occidentalis-Many at Koosharem Reservoir, one at Lake Powell Clark's Grebe Aechmophorus clarkii-Seen with Western Grebe at Koosharem for good comparisons Double-crested Cormorant Phalacrocorax auritus-Many at Koosharem Reservoir & Lake Powell, Pair American White Pelican Pelecanus erythrorhynchos-Large flock in air near SLC airport, one at Koosharem Reservoir Great Blue Heron Ardea herodias-Seen often at many locations Great Egret Ardea alba-Seen at Koosharem Reservoir Black-crowned Night-Heron Nycticorax nycticorax -On the shore at Koosharem Reservoir Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura-Seen daily at all locations California Condor Gymnogyps californianus-#722 at Navajo Bridge, 8 in air at Vermilion Cliffs condor release location **Osprey** Pandion haliaetus-Pair spotted by Lesley flying along the Virgin River at Grafton Golden Eagle Aquila chrysaetos-Close looks on a pole and in flight on Hwy 89 driving to Page Northern Harrier Circus cyaneus-Good scope looks at Koosharem Reservoir, at Lake Powell, & Yaki Point Sharp-shinned Hawk Accipiter striatus-Seen migrating at Yaki and Hopi Points, Grand Canyon Cooper's Hawk Accipiter cooperii-Seen migrating in Grand Canyon, good scope looks at Grafton Red-tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis-Seen almost daily in many locations

American Coot Fulica americana-Large numbers at Koosharem Reservoir, Lake Powell, & other ponds Killdeer Charadrius vociferus-Seen at motel ponds, Koosharem Reservoir. & Lake Powell Red-necked Phalarope Phalaropus lobatus-Scope looks & feeding behavior at Koosharem Reservoir Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis-Close looks at motel ponds, many at Koosharem Reservoir California Gull Larus californicus-Large flock in the air near SLC airport Rock Pigeon Columba livia-Seen at many locations near towns Eurasian Collared-Dove Streptopelia decaocto-Seen often in small towns Mourning Dove Zenaida macroura-Seen often in many locations and habitats Greater Roadrunner Geococcyx californianus-First one spotted by Gerry, seen near the Lake Powell Resort Long-eared Owl Asio otus-Heard behind the Subway in Torrey, Utah White-throated Swift Aeronautes saxatalis-Spotted by Gillian at Boulder Pond, in Zion Canyon Black-chinned Hummingbird Archilochus alexandri-Feeders at Calf Creek Falls, identified by Gill & Gerald at Mimi's feeders in Springdale Broad-tailed Hummingbird Selasphorus platycercus-Feeders at Calf Creek Falls Rufous Hummingbird Selasphorus rufus-Feeders at Calf Creek Falls Belted Kingfisher Megaceryle alcyon-Spotted by Gill on drive to Torrey, UT Acorn Woodpecker Melanerpes formicivorus-Seen briefly on south rim walk, Grand Canyon Willliamson's Sapsucker Sphyrapicus nuchalis-Good looks on south rim walk, Grand Canyon Red-naped Sapsucker Sphyrapicus nuchalis-Close looks on a tree at Grafton Downy Woodpecker Picoides pubescens-Many seen on the fruit trees in Fruita Hairy Woodpecker Picoides villosus-Seen near the Fremont River in Fruita Northern Flicker Colaptes auratus-Seen often at most locations American Kestrel Falco sparverius-Seen in the Salt Lake City hotel lot Merlin Falco columbarius-Seen while waiting for the Grand Canyon shuttle Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus-Seen at Yaki & Hopi Points, Grand Canyon & pair in Zion Western Wood-Pewee Contopus sordidulus-Seen in Torrey and Bryce's Rainbow Point Willow Flycatcher Empidonax traillii-In a willow tree at the Boulder pond Say's Phoebe Sayornis saya-Seen at Lake Powell Resort & Grafton Vermilion Flycatcher Pyrocephalus rubinus-Female seen in Grafton field Ash-throated Flycatcher Myiarchus cinerascens-Seen in a tree along the Fremont River in Fruita Western Kingbird Tyrannus verticalis-Perched at the top of a tree in Grafton Plumbeous Vireo Vireo plumbeus-Seen at Sunrise Point in Bryce & rim walk at Grand Canyon Cassin's Vireo Vireo cassinii-Two seen in the bushes at Grafton Pinyon Jay Gymnorhinus cyanocephalus-After watching for them, found a flock over our room at the lodge in Grand Canyon Steller's Jay Cyanocitta stelleri-Seen at numerous locations at higher elevations Western Scrub-Jay Aphelocoma californica-First seen at Boulder pond, then at numerous locations Black-billed Magpie Pica hudsonia-First seen in Salt Lake City, then often on drive from Bryce to Page Clark's Nutcracker Nucifraga columbiana-First seen in Capitol Reef, then at numerous locations American Crow Corvus brachyrhynchos-Seen in Salt Lake City **Common Raven** Corvus corax-Seen daily at all locations Violet-green Swallow Tachycineta thalassina-Seen over pond in Salt Lake City Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica-Seen over pond in Salt Lake City & at Fruita **Cliff Swallow** *Petrochelidon pyrrhonota*-Seen over ponds in Salt Lake City Mountain Chickadee Poecile gambeli-First seen at Larb Hollow overlook & often in pine forest habitat Juniper Titmouse Baeolophus ridgwayi-Seen on the south rim walk, Grand Canyon Bushtit Psaltriparus minimus-Flocks of these busy birds seen at Calf Creek Falls & Grand Canyon Red-breasted Nuthatch Sitta canadensis-Heard clearly at Larb Hollow Overlook

White-breasted (Western) Nuthatch Sitta carolinensis-First seen at Larb Hollow, seen often afterwards Pygmy Nuthatch Sitta pygmaea-Seen at Larb Holllow, Bryce & Grand Canyon Brown Creeper Certhia americana-Heard & then seen on the Bristlecone Pine Trail, Bryce Rock Wren Salpinctes obsoletus-Seen often including Bryce & Grafton Cemetery Canyon Wren Catherpes mexicanus-Surprisingly, found at the Geology Museum, Grand Canyon Bewick's Wren Thryomanes bewickii-Two seen in a field at Grafton American Dipper Cinclus mexicanus-Two adults & a juvenile seen in the Calf Creek Ruby-crowned Kinglet Regulus calendula-Seen often including Fruita, Bryce, Grand Canyon & Grafton Western Bluebird Sialia mexicana-Seen often at many locations Mountain Bluebird Sialia currucoides-Seen in Torrey with Western Bluebirds for nice comparison Townsend's Solitaire Myadestes townsendi-Heard & eventually seen at Bryce Lodge grounds Hermit Thrush Catharus guttatus-Seen in Fruita & two on the Bristlecone Pine Trail, Bryce American Robin Turdus migratorius-Seen occasionally at many locations European Starling Sturnus vulgaris-Seen often in towns and on wires Orange-crowned Warbler Oreothlypis celata-First seen in Boulder, again in Bryce & Lake Powell Yellow-rumped (Audubon's) Warbler Setophaga coronata-Seen often including Bryce, Lake Powell, Grand Canyon & many at Grafton Black-throated Gray Warbler Setophaga nigrescens-More than one seen on the south rim walk, Grand Canyon Townsend's Warbler Setpphaga townsendi-Good looks at a number of birds on the south rim walk, Grand Canyon Brewer's Sparrow Spizella breweri-Seen in the bushes at Grafton Dark-eyed Junco (Gray-headed) Junco hyemalis-Seen at Bryce on rim walk & at Lake Powell White-crowned Sparrow Zonotrichia leucophrys-Seen often including Torrey, Lake Powell & Grafton Vesper Sparrow Pooecetes gramineus-Seen in the bushes at Grafton Lincoln's Sparrow Melospiza lincolnii-Heard singing & seen in bushes at Grafton Spotted Towhee Pipilo maculatus-Heard in the bushes at Grafton Summer Tanager Piranga rubra-Heard then seen on treetop in Grafton Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta-On a fence line in Torrey agricultural field Brewer's Blackbird Euphagus cyanocephalus-Seen at Ruby pond horse field & Grand Canyon Great-tailed Grackle Quiscalus mexicanus-Salt Lake City, town of Page, town of Kanab Brown-headed Cowbird Molothrus ater-In tree with Brewer's in Grand Canyon House Finch Haemorhous mexicanus-On fence in field at Ruby's pond Cassin's Finch Haemorhous cassinii-On trail to Sunset Point, Bryce Lesser Goldfinch Spinus psaltria-Nice male seen on the south rim walk, Grand Canyon American Goldfinch Spinus tristis-Seen in Fruita, south rim walk & Grafton fields **House Sparrow** *Passer domesticus*-Large flock seen & heard in Torrey

MAMMALS

American Bison Bison bison-Probably not wild, seen on drive to Page

Striped Plateau Lizard Sceloporus virgatus-Seen on a rock at Capitol Reef

Mule Deer Odocoileus hemionus-Seen at many locations

White-tailed Deer Odocoileus virginianus-Seen on drive to Grand Canyon

Rock Squirrel Spermophilus variegatus-Seen at most locations including Capitol Reef, Bryce, etc.

Cliff Chipmunk Tamias dorsalis- Seen often at Bryce

Least Chipmunk Tamias minimus-This small chipmunk seen often at Capitol Reef
Desert Cottontail Sylvilagus audubonii-Seen on hike in slot canyon, Capitol Reef
Utah Prairie Dog Cynomys parvidens-Prairie dog town in Bryce & near Ruby's pond
Elk Cervus elaphus-Many seen at Grand Canyon national Park
Bighorn Sheep Ovis canadensis-Good spotting by Gill on return boat trip on Lake Powell
Collard Lizard Crotaphytus collaris-This beautiful lizard seen on hike to Rainbow Bridge
