**Summary:** We left the long U.S. winter to enjoy the warm Belize weather, five of us traveling to Crooked Tree Sanctuary for the pre-trip extension, joined by six more travelers for the boat trip to Lamanai on the New River. The combination of delightful boat trips, birding among Mayan ruins, and delicious meals highlighted our stay at Lamanai Outpost. We journeyed north by land through the Mennonite area on the Mexico border to Chan Chich to experience the charm of one of the most beautiful ecolodges in the world, cradled in a valley surrounded by unexcavated Mayan ruins. Walking the trails, swimming in the pool, and visiting areas near Gallon Jug, as well as enjoying our delicious meals on their porch, completed this delightful stay. During our tour, we were fortunate to see all of the possible herons & egrets, parrots, woodpeckers, and four of the five Central American kingfishers. What a truly magical trip to this welcoming country, Belize!

#### **TINAMIDAE: Tinamous (1)**

**Great Tinamou** *Tinamus major*—(HO) We heard this elusive species in Chan Chich near the river bridge

#### **ANATIDAE: Ducks And Geese (3)**

**Black-bellied Whistling-Duck** *Dendrocygna autumnalis*—A large number of these ducks in Crooked Tree's big pond our first afternoon

**Fulvous Whistling-Duck** *Dendrocygna* bicolor—Seen with other ducks in the big pond our first afternoon at Crooked Tree

Blue-winged Teal Spatula discors— Swimming in the Crooked Tree big pond with other ducks

#### **CRACIDAE:** Guans And Chachalacas (3)

**Plain Chachalaca** Ortalis vetula—This noisy species was heard and often seen daily at Lamanai **Crested Guan** Penelope purpurascens— Quite exciting to see these large birds at the top of trees daily at Chan Chich

Great Curassow Crax rubra—Males & females seen along the trails at Lamanai and Chan Chich,

#### **ODONTOPHORIDAE: New World Quail (1)**

Black-throated Bobwhite (YE) Colinus nigrogularis—Their covey eruption startled us on our walk at

#### PHASIANIDAE: Grouse, Pheasants and Partridges (1)

**Ocellated Turkey (YE)** *Meleagris ocellata*— A group favorite, many of this colorful species live at Chan Chich; males were demonstrating for the attention of the females

#### **PODICIPEDIDAE: Grebes (1)**

Pied-billed Grebe Podilymbus podiceps—Seen on our boat trips on the New River at Lamanai

#### **COLUMBIDAE: Pigeons and Doves (12)**

**Rock Pigeon** *Columba livia*—Spotted in Belize City during transfers

Pale-vented Pigeon Patagioenas cayennensis—Most common pigeon, seen or heard daily at all locations Scaled Pigeon Patagioenas speciosa—Great scope looks at tree top from Chan Chich Lodge Red-billed Pigeon Patagioenas flavirostris—Heard & seen often in trees around Indian Church village Short-billed Pigeon Patagioenas nigrirostris—Seen on our trip to Laguna Verde near Gallon Jug Eurasian Collared-Dove Streptopelia decaocto—Quick looks at 3 while walking at Indian Church Village Ruddy Ground-Dove Columbina talpacoti—Most common ground-dove; seen daily at all locations Blue Ground-Dove Claravis pretiosa—Often only heard, one was spotted in the trail near Lamanai ruins Ruddy Quail-Dove Geotrygon montana—On our early drive to Gallon Jug, many were seen in the road White-tipped Dove Leptotila verreauxi—Occasion looks walking on the trails at Lamanai & Chan Chich Gray-headed Dove Leptotila plumbeiceps—On our last morning we finally saw this species on Sylvester Village Road

White-winged Dove Zenaida asiatica—Seen perched & flying at locations at Lamanai

#### **CUCULIDAE: Cuckoos (3)**

**Groove-billed Ani** *Crotophaga sulcirostris*—Small groups seen on Crooked Tree & Lamanai boat tours **Striped Cuckoo** *Tapera naevia*—(HO) Distinctive call heard on boat tour of the Crooked Tree big pond **Squirrel Cuckoo** *Piaya cayana*—Nice looks often at all locations

#### **CAPRIMULGIDAE: Nighthawks and Nightjars (3)**

**Lesser Nighthawk** Chardeiles acutipennis—Found roosting by our guide on boat trip on the New River **Common Pauraque** Nyctidromus albicollis—On the road after leaving Crooked Tree, heard & seen on night drive at Chan Chich

Yucatan Nightjar (YE) Antrostomus badius—Close looks at one roosting on Lamanai Spotlight cruise

#### **NYCTIBIIDAE: Potoos (1)**

Northern Potoo Nyctibius jamaicensis—Great looks at individuals on Lamani & Chan Chich night drives

#### **APODIDAE: Swifts (1)**

Vaux's Swift Chaetura vauxi—Seen feeding in flight above Gallon Jug agricultural fields

#### **TROCHILIDAE: Hummingbirds (12)**

White-necked Jacobin Florisuga mellivora—The most aggressive hummer at Chan Chich feeders Long-billed Hermit Phaethornis longirostris—Second most common species at Chan Chich feeders Stripe-throated Hermit Phaethornis striigularis—Seen at Chan Chich feeders with Long-billed Hermits

Wedge-tailed Sabrewing Campylopterus curvipennis—In flowering tree at bridge with 5 other species White-bellied Emerald Amazilia candida—Feeding in flowering tree at Chan Chich bridge Azure-crowned Hummingbird Amazilia cyanocephala—Quick looks during our walk at Lamanai savanna Rufous-tailed Hummingbird Amazilia tzacatl—Very common hummingbird seen at all locations

#### RALLIDAE: Rails, Crakes, and Coots (3)

**Russet-naped Wood-Rail** *Aramides albiventris*—Fun seeing this species out in the open on Crooked Tree boat ride & again on Lamanai spotlight cruise

**Purple Gallinule** *Porphyrio martinica*—Adults & immatures seen on our Crooked Tree boat ride **Ruddy Crake** *Laterallus ruber*—(HO) Vocalizing clearly on our boat ride to the Lamanai savanna

#### **HELIORNITHIDAE:** Sungrebe (1)

**Sungrebe** *Heliornis fulica*—After just missing, but hearing, this species on the trip to Lamanai savanna, we had great scope looks at one on our afternoon trip to Laguna Verde

#### **ARAMIDAE: Limpkin (1)**

Limpkin Aramus quarauna — Many individuals seen & heard often at Crooked Tree & Lamanai

#### **RECURVIROSTRIDAE: Stilts and Avocets (1)**

Black-necked Stilt Himantopus mexicanus—Flock of 15 together on shore on Crooked Tree boat trip

#### **CHARADRIIDAE: Plovers and Lapwings (1)**

Killdeer Charadrius vociferous—Seen & vocalizing on our boat ride at Crooked Tree

#### JACANIDAE: Jacanas (1)

Northern Jacana Jacana spinosa—Seen daily at Crooked Tree & along New River at Lamani

#### SCOLOPACIDAE: Sandpipers and Allies (1)

Spotted Sandpiper Actitis macularius—Seen on shore at Crooked Tree & Lamani

#### LARIDAE: Gulls and Terns (2)

**Gull-billed Tern** *Gelochelidon nilotica*—Seen during Crooked Tree boat ride & on the New River **Caspian Tern** *Hydroprogne caspia*—Seen often flying over the Crooked Tree Sanctuary

#### **CICONIIDAE: Storks (2)**

**Jabiru** *Jabiru mycteria*—Large number (36+) on the Crooked Tree Sanctuary; one on the savanna at Lamanai during sunset cocktail cruise for great photo opportunity

**Wood Stork** *Mycteria americana*—Hundreds at Crooked Tree Sanctuary & seen flying at Lamani; 6 seen in rice fields on drive to Chan Chich

#### **ANHINGIDAE: Anhingas (1)**

Anhinga Anhinga anhinga—Spotted flying on Crooked Tree boat ride

#### **PHALACROCORACIDAE: Cormorants (2)**

**Neotropic Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax brasilianus*—Most common cormorant, seen daily around water **Double-crested Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax auritus*—Rare visitor, seen on Lamanai Mayan ruin dock

#### PELECANIDAE: Pelicans (1)

**American White Pelican** *Pelecanus erythrorhynchos*—Seen with thousands of other water birds at Crooked Creek Sanctuary

#### ARDEIDAE: Herons and Egrets (13)

**Least Bittern** *Ixobrychus exilis*—Quick look, flying into the reeds on return from the Lamanai savanna **Bare-throated Tiger-Heron** *Tigrisoma mexicanum*—Great looks in the open at Crooked Tree, at Lamanai, & the pond at Chan Chich village

**Great Blue Heron** *Ardea herodias*—Seen often at water locations & spotlight cruise at Lamanai **Great Egret** *Ardea alba*—Seen often at all water locations

**Snowy Egret** *Egretta thula*—Seen often on shore at most water locations

**Little Blue Heron** *Egretta caerulea*—Adults & immatures seen along New River Lagoon & other locations **Tricolored Heron** *Egretta tricolor*—Seen with other wading birds at Crooked Tree Sanctuary

Cattle Egret Bubulcus ibis—Where we saw cows, we saw this species

Green Heron Butorides virescens—Very common at all water locations

**Agami Heron** *Agamia agami*—Exciting spotting! Great looks & pictures on the Lamanai spotlight trip **Black-crowned Night-Heron** *Nycticorax nycticorax*—Spotted roosting on Crooked Tree & Lamanai **Yellow-crowned Night-Heron** *Nyctanassa violacea*—Along water locations & on the night drive at Chan Chich

**Boat-billed Heron** *Cochlearius* —Good numbers on the Crooked Tree boat trip & spotlight boat ride

#### THRESKIORNITHIDAE: Ibis and Spoonbills (3)

White Ibis Eudocimus albus—Large numbers at Crooked Tree; a few at Lamanai; in the Mennonite rice fields

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus—Seen in small numbers on the Crooked Tree boat ride

Roseate Spoonbill Platalea ajaja—Good numbers seen feeding with other waders at Crooked Tree

#### **CATHARTIDAE: New World Vultures (4)**

King Vulture Sarcoramphus papa—Spotted by Ruben, great looks at three above us on the New River Black Vulture Coragyps atratus—Seen daily at all locations in good numbers Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura—Fewer than Black, seen daily at all locations Lesser Yellow-headed Vulture Cathartes burrovianus—Close looks at one's head at Crooked Tree; others seen around Lamanai

#### **PANDIONIDAE: Osprey (1)**

Osprey Pandion haliaetus—Seen on the Crooked Tree & Lamanai boat trips

#### **ACCIPITRIDAE: Hawks, Kites, and Eagles (7)**

White-tailed Kite Elanus leucurus—Spotted soaring during our afternoon walk at Indian Church Hook-billed Kite Chondrohierax uncinatus—Two seen on our first walk at Chan Chich near the village Ornate Hawk-Eagle Spizaetus ornatus—(HO) Heard twice soaring above Chan Chich trails Snail Kite Rostrhamus sociabilis— Large numbers seen on Crooked Tree boat trip; seen often on boat trips at Lamanai on the New River lagoon

**Double-toothed Kite** *Harpagus bidentatus*—Spotted soaring twice on walks at Chan Chich **Roadside Hawk** *Rupornis magnirostris*— Seen almost daily at all locations **Gray Hawk** *Buteo plagiatus*—Seen perched on our afternoon walk in Indian Church village

#### **TYTONIDAE: Barn Owls (1)**

Barn Owl Tyto alba—Adults with two juveniles nesting at Lamanai dock

#### STRIGIDAE: Owls (3)

**Spectacled Owl** *Pulsatrix perspicillata*—What a treat to see 2 adults perched near Lamanai village **Ferruginous Pygmy-Own** *Glaucidium brasilianum*—(HO) Heard each morning before dawn at Beck's **Black-and-White Owl** *Ciccaba nigrolineata*—Seen on a wire during Chan Chich night drive

#### **TROGONIDAE: Trogons (3)**

Slaty-tailed Trogon Trogon massena—Seen on two of our Chan Chich village walks
Black-headed Trogon Trogon melanocephalus—Seen well at Lamanai lodge; again on Chan Chich walk
Gartered Trogon Trogon caligatus—Seen on Mayan ruin walks; again the last morning at Chan Chich

#### **ALCEDINIDAE: Kingfishers (4)**

Ringed Kingfisher Megaceryle torquata—Seen often in large numbers at Crooked Tree & New River Belted Kingfisher Megaceryle alcyon—Seen on Crooked Tree boat ride & New Lagoon boat trips American Pygmy Kingfisher Chloroceryle aenea—Wow, we saw this diminutive & very cute species very often & at close range at Crooked Tree, Lamanai, & Chan Chich

Green Kingfisher Chloroceryle americana—Seen at Crooked Tree, Lamanai, & Chan Chich

#### **BUCCONIDAE: Puffbirds (2)**

White-necked Puffbird Notharchus hyperrhynchus—Spotted during a morning drive at Chan Chich White-whiskered Puffbird Malacoptila panamensis—Spotted perched during our drive to Laguna Verde

#### **GALBULIDAE: Jacamars (1)**

**Rufous-tailed Jacamar** *Galbula ruficauda*—Four of this species were demonstrating during our walk at the Mayan ruins; another seen at Chan Chich

#### **RAMPHASTIDAE: Toucans (2)**

**Collared Aracari** *Pteroglossus torquatus*—Good looks at Lamanai ruins; seen again on Chan Chich walks **Keel-billed Toucan** *Ramphastos sulfuratus*—Surprisingly, we didn't see this species until our trips around Gallon Jug; always a crowd favorite!

#### **PICIDAE: Woodpeckers (10)**

Yellow-bellied Sapsucker Sphyrapicus varius—Seen well while following the jays at Beck's

Chestnut-colored Woodpecker Celeus castaneus—What a beauty! Great looks at 2 at Lamanai
Golden-olive Woodpecker Piculus rubiginosus—Two were interacting near Chan Chich bridge

#### **FALCONIDAE: Falcons and Caracaras (3)**

**Laughing Falcon** *Herptotheres cachinnans*—We saw this species well 3 times around Gallon Jug **American Kestrel** *Falco sparverius*—Spotted perched on the barn on ride to Laguna Verde **Bat Falcon** *Falco rufiqularis*—Seen at Lamanai; pair nesting near Chan Chich cabins

#### **PSITTACIDAE: Parrots (8)**

**Brown-hooded Parrot** *Pyrilia haematotis*—After quick flybys, had 3 perched near Chan Chich bridge **White-crowned Parrot** *Pionus senilis*—Scope views of perched birds above Chan Chich lodge **Red-lored Parrot** *Amazona autumnalis*—Most common parrot seen well at most locations **Yellow-headed Parrot** *Amazona oratrix*—Good scope views of a distance bird at Lamanai savanna **White-fronted Parrot** *Amazona albifrons*—Seen & heard often at Lamanai & Chan Chich **Yellow-lored Parrot (YE)** *Amazona xantholora*—Luckily, we found 7 perched in a close tree for scope views of the yellow lores on the Lamanai savanna walk

Mealy Parrot Amazona farinosa—Scope views at Laguna Verde

Olive-throated Parakeet Eupsittula nana—Seen & heard daily in good numbers at all locations

#### **THAMNOPHILIDAE: Antbirds (2)**

**Barred Antshrike** *Thamnophilus doliatus*—Male & female seen well the first Lamanai morning walk **Dusky Antbird** *Cercomacroides tyrannina*—Pair seen well on Lamanai sugar mill walk

#### **FORMICARIIDAE: Antthrushes (1)**

Black-faced Antthrush Formicarius analis—(HO) Another difficult species, heard often but not seen

#### **FURNARIIDAE: Ovenbirds (5)**

**Scaly-throated Leaftosser** *Sclerurus guatemalensis*—(HO) Heard very close to us across the stream at Chan Chich

Olivaceous Woodcreeper Sittasomus griseicapillus—Good looks at the Lamanai sugar mill

Tawny-winged Woodcreeper Dendrocincla anabatina—Nice looks at 2 near the Chan Chich pond

Ivory-billed Woodcreeper Xiphorhynchus flavigaster—Most common woodcreeper; heard or seen daily

Buff-throated Foliage-gleaner Automolus ochrolaemus—Seen close to us at the Chan Chich stream

#### **TYRANNIDAE: Tyrant Flycatchers (26)**

Northern Beardless-Tyrannulet Camptostoma imberbe—Seen on our walk at Beck's Yellow-bellied Tyrannulet Ornithion semiflavum—Seen quickly on morning walk at Chan Chich village

Tropical Pewee Contopus cinereus—Seen often; best look in tree at Chan Chich bridge
Yellow-bellied Flycatcher Empidonax flaviventris—Spotted twice on walks at Chan Chich
White-throated Flycatcher Empidonax albigularis—Heard first; then spotted in the reeds on Lamanai
Savanna from the boat

**Least Flycatcher** *Empidodonax minimus*—Seen at Crooked Tree & the Lamanai savanna **Vermilion Flycatcher** *Pyrocephalus rubinus*—Many photographed at Crooked Tree; also on Lamanai savanna

Northern Rough-winged Swallow Stelgidopteryx serripennis—Seen on Lamanai boat trips
Purple Martin Progne subis—Few seen flying low over Lamanai savanna
Gray-breasted Martin Progne chalybea—Many at Crooked Tree & Chan Chich airstrip
Tree Swallow Tachycineta bicolor—Seen over the Lamanai savanna
Mangrove Swallow Tachycineta albilinea—Seen daily at all locations

#### **TROGLODYTIDAE: Wrens (4)**

House Wren Troglodytes aedon—Seen & heard often at all locations

**Carolina Wren** *Thryothorus Iudovicianus*—(HO) Formerly White-browed, heard on Lamanai savanna **Spot-breasted Wren** *Pheugopedius maculipectus*—What fun to see this species, so often only heard, on Lamanai & Chan Chich walks

White-breasted Wood-Wren Henicorhina leucosticte—Seen well along Chan Chich road

#### **POLIOPTILIDAE: Gnatcatchers (2)**

**Long-billed Gnatwren** *Ramphocaenus melanurus*—Seen with mixed flock at Chan Chich Upper Plaza **Blue-gray Gnatcatcher** *Polioptila caerulea*—Seen at Beck's & on Lamanai savanna

#### **TURDIDAE: Thrushes (4)**

**Swainson's Thrush** *Catharus ustulatus*—This migrant was seen on the road during Chan Chich walks **Wood Thrush** *Hylocichla mustelina*—Seen on walks at Lamanai & Chan Chich **White-throated Thrush** *Turdus assimilis*—(HO) We heard & tried hard to see this species at Chan Chich **Clay-colored Thrush** *Turdus grayi*—Seen daily at all locations

Kentucky Warbler Geothlypis formosa—Watched 2 at close range bathing in Chan Chich stream

Hooded Warbler Setophaga citrina—With other warblers bathing in Chan Chich stream
American Redstart Setophaga ruticilla—Another warbler seen frequently at all locations
Northern Parula Setophaga americana—Seen on Lamanai Mayan ruin walk
Magnolia Warbler Setophaga magnolia—Seen daily at Lamanai & Chan Chich
Yellow Warbler Setophaga petechia—Seen often whenever we were near water
