



Arizona Sunshine & Saguaros 2016 Tour Species List Guide: Dodie Logue with 3 participants: Andy, Becky & Jane

Ducks, Geese & Swans

Canada Goose (Branta canadensis) - Seen at the Gilbert Water Ranch, (GWR).

Snow Goose (Chen caerulescens) - A surprising five seen near Buckeye, we stopped at some ponds along Baseline Rd - life birds for Andy and Becky!

Mallard (Anas platyrhynchos) - Seen at a few places, also "Mexican Mallards" at Agua Caliente.

Gadwall (Anas strepera) - Sweetwater Wetlands and Agua Caliente.

American Wigeon (Anas americana) - Quite common on the tour, seen at many places.

Blue-winged Teal (Anas discors) - Just a lone female seen at Sweetwater Wetlands.

Cinnamon Teal (Anas cyanoptera) - Seen at Sweetwater Wetlands.

Northern Shoveler (Anas clypeata) - Another very common duck, seen most days.

Green-winged Teal (Anas crecca) - Another very common duck, seen most days.

Ring-necked Duck (Aythya collaris) - There were many Ring-Necks at the first pong at the GWR.

Lesser Scaup (Aythya affinis) - A couple were spotted by Jane at the end of our morning at the GWR.

Bufflehead (Bucephala albeola) - One lone duck at a back pond at the GWR.

Ruddy Duck (Oxyura jamaicensis) - Seen a few places, some males in beautiful breeding plumage.

Upland Game Birds

Gambel's Quail (Callipepla gambeli) - Surprisingly scarce, just a few seen on a few days.

Loons & Grebes

Pied-billed Grebe (Podilymbuspodiceps) - Seen at most of the water places we birded.

Cormorants

Neotropic Cormorant (Phalacrocorax brasilianus) - We had good looks at the GWR, close views.

Wading Birds

Great Blue Heron (Ardea horodias) - Just a couple seen near water areas.

Great Egret (Ardea alba) - Seen flying and wading.

Snowy Egret (Egretta thula) - Good looks at the GWR.

Hawks & Vultures

Turkey Vulture (Carthartes aura) - Fairly common, seen most days.

Black Vulture (Coragyps atratus) - Only one individual seen the whole trip, on day 4.

Northern Harrier (Circus cyaneus) - Surprisingly scarce, just glimpses of one on two days.

Cooper's Hawk (Accipiter cooperii) - More common than Sharp-shinned, seen most days. Very good looks at one in a tree at Catalina State Park the last morning.

Harris's Hawk (Parabuteo unicinctus) - A quick fly-by from the car one afternoon, luckily we had one on a telephone pole and then flying by the Red Rocks Feedlot.

Red-tailed Hawk (Buteo jamaicensis)- Very common, seen almost every day.

Golden Eagle (Aquila chrysaetos) - Two individuals seen soaring on separate days, the long, flat wings and large head very apparent.

Rails, Coots, Cranes & Limpkins

Common Gallinule (Gallinula galeata) - A couple seen at Sweetwater Wetlands.

American Coot (Fulica americana) - Common, seen most places where there was water.

Sora (Porzana carolina) - One heard at Sweetwater Wetlands, we saw reeds moving but never glimpsed the bird.

Shorebirds

Killdeer (Charadrius vociferus) - Common.

Black-necked Stilt (Himantopus mexicanus) - This lovely bird was seen in good numbers at the GWR.

American Avocet (Recurvirostra americana) - Also seen in good numbers at the GWR, in various states of plumage, some in full breeding attire.

Greater Yellowlegs (Tringa melanoleuca) - A couple seen at the GWR.

Long-billed Curlew (Numenius americanus) - A huge flock seen at a distance near a roadside pond in Buckeye, the long bill and golden underwing were just barely visible.

Least Sandpiper (Calidris minutilla) - These small peeps were quite common any where there was muddy shore.

Long-billed Dowitcher (Limnodromus scolopaceus) - A handful of these shorebirds were seen at the GWR.

Pigeons & Doves

Rock Pigeon (Columba livia) - Seen everyday.

White-winged Dove (Zenaida asiatica) - Just a couple were seen associating through the fence with the White-winged Doves that were in the aviary at the Desert Museum.

Mourning Dove (Zenaida macroura) - Seen daily.

Eurasian Collared-Dove (Streptopelia decaocto) - This bird has become quite common and was seen most days.

Inca Dove (Columbina inca) - Once very common, we only saw a couple of these at the GWR.

Cuckoos

Greater Roadrunner (Geococcyx californianus) - We had glimpses of these, mostly while driving, on a few days.

Owls

Great Horned Owl (Bubo virginianus) - We snacked under a nest our last morning at Catalina State Park, one bird was on the nest.

Burrowing Owl (Athene cunicularia) - One owl flew right to the group as we were standing by the road scanning at the Santa Cruz Flats; another was seen by a pond in Buckeye.

Hummingbirds

Anna's Hummingbird (Calypte anna) - The most common Hummingbird of the trip, seen most days.

Costa's Hummingbird Calypte costae) - The second most common Hummingbird.

Black-chinned Hummingbird (Archilochus alexandri) - Just starting to migrate through, we saw one clear individual.

Broad-tailed Hummingbird (Selasphorus platycercus) - The tail-whirring sound they make is diagnostic, heard and seen a few times.

Broad-billed Hummingbird (Cynanthus latiristris) - Great looks at our evening walk at Rio Vista.

Trogons & Kingfishers

Belted Kingfisher (Megaceryle alcyon) - One seen flying at Agua Caliente.

Woodpeckers

Acorn Woodpecker (Melanerpes formicivorus) - Seen at higher elevations, we has some on our day up the Santa Catalinas.

Gila Woodpecker (Melanerpes uropygialis) - Very common, heard and seen every day.

Red-naped Sapsucker (Sphyrapicus nuchalis) - One beautiful individual seen at our picnic spot at Bear Canyon in the Santa Catalinas.

Yellow-bellied Sapsucker (Sphyrapicus varius) - Unusual for this area, one seen at Boyce Thompson Arboretum.

Ladder-backed Woodpecker (Picoides scalaris) - A common woodpecker of lower elevations and desert habitat.

Northern Flicker (Colaptes auratus) - Seem and/or heard most days.

Gilded Flicker (Colaptes chrysoides) - We had decent looks on a few days of this lovely bird.

Falcons

Peregrine Falcon (Falco peregrinus) - One seen soaring with a Red-tail on our way down Kitt Peak.

Prairie Falcon (Falco mexicanus) - A fly-by individual seen at Sweetwater Wetlands.

American Kestrel (Falco sparverius) - This beautiful falcon was seen on a few days, usually on the wires along the road.

Merlin (Falco columbarius) - A lovely "Prairie" Merlin was seen perched at close range at the Santa Cruz Flats.

Crested Caracara (Caracara cheriway) - We had a surprising number of these; one perched along the road on our way to Kitt Peak, one distant flying while we were at San Xavier, and a few in fields at the Santa Cruz flats.

Tyrant Flycatchers & Becard

Gray Flycatcher (Empidonax wrightii) - One individual seen a few times at Catalina State Park.

Black Phoebe (Sayornis nigricans) - Seen on a few days, this flycatcher likes to be around water.

Say's Phoebe (Sayornis saya) - A common bird, but we only saw a few times.

Vermillion Flycatcher (Pyrocephalus rubinus) - Many great looks at this lovely bird, both male and female.

Ash-throated Flycatcher (Myiarchus cinerascens) - Recently migrated to AZ, seen at the Santa Cruz Flats, and Andy and Becky had one the last morning at Catalina State Park.

Northern Beardless-Tyrannulet (Camptostoma imberbe) - One individual briefly seen and heard our last morning.

Shrikes

Loggerhead Shrike (Lanius ludovicianus) - Seen a few days, usually perched in low shrubs or on the wires.

Vireos

Bell's Vireo (Vireo bellii) - Seen and heard at Agua Caliente, Boyce Thompson, and Catalina SP.

Hutton's Vireo (Vireo huttoni) - Seen on our mountain day up in the Catalinas.

Crows & Jays

Mexican Jay (Aphelocoma wollweberi) - A bird seen at higher elevation, seen in the Catalinas and on Kitt Peak.

Common Raven (Corvus corax) - Common and seen most days.

Larks

Horned Lark (Eremophila alpestris) - Seen at the Avra Valley Water treatment place, and in plowed fields at the Santa Cruz Flats.

Swallows

Violet-green Swallow (Tachycineta thalassina) - A few of this recently returned bird at Agua Caliente.

Northern Rough-winged Swallow (Stelgidopteryx serripennis) - Common and seen at a few stops.

Cliff Swallow (Petrochelidon pyrrhonota) - A group of these were seen going under a large culvert at the Santa Cruz flats.

Chickadees & Allies

Bridled Titmouse (Baeolophus wollweberi) - This cute bird was seen on our day to the Catalinas.

Verdin (Auriparus flaviceps) - Common and seen everyday.

Bushtit (Psaltriparus minimus) - Just a glimpse on our day to the Catalinas.

Nuthatches & Creeper

White-breasted Nuthatch (Sitta carolinensis) - Seen at higher elevations in the Catalinas.

Pygmy Nuthatch (Sitta pygmaea)- Seen at Rose Canyon in the Catalinas.

Brown Creeper (Certhia americana) - Seen at Rose Canyon in the Catalinas.

Wrens

Bewick's Wren (Thryomanes bewickii) - A fairly common wren, seen a few times.

House Wren (Troglodytes aedon) - Surprisingly, just seen once, on our third day up in the Catalinas.

Marsh Wren (Cistothorus palustris) - Heard at Sweetwater Wetlands and Agua Caliente.

Cactus Wren (Camphlorhynchus brunneicapillus) - Common and seen most days.

Canyon Wren (Catherpes mexicanus) - Seen a few times, best looks at a stop along the road to Kitt Peak.

Rock Wren (Salpinctes obsoletus) - Seen a few times, we had one join us for lunch in Saguaro West.

Gnatcatchers, Kinglets & Others

Black-tailed Gnatcatcher (Polioptila melanura) - Common in desert-brushy areas.

Ruby-crowned Kinglet (Regulus calendula) - Seen most days.

Thrushes

Western Bluebird (Sialia mexicana) - A small group seen at Rose Canyon in the Catalinas.

Hermit Thrush (Catharus guttatus) - Seen a few days, including at Catalina State Park.

Rufous-backed Robin (Turdus rufopalliatus) - We had great looks at this lovely rare bird on our last morning at Catalina SP, it was in the hackberries in the riparian area.

Mockingbirds, Thrashers, Starlings, Accentors, Wagtails & Pitpits

Northern Mockingbird (Mimus polyglottos) - A common bird seen most days.

Sage Thrasher (Oreoscoptes montanus) - One bird seen at the "Thrasher Spot" near Buckeye.

Le Conte's Thrasher (Toxostoma lecontei) - Very brief backlit looks in the scope at an individual bird just as we were about to leave the "Thrasher Spot", it quickly went aground and we never re-found it.

Bendire's Thrasher (Toxostoma bendirei) - Decent looks at this bird as it perched up and sang at the "Thrasher Spot".

Curve-billed Thrasher (Toxostoma curvirostre) - Seen and heard every day.

European Starling (Sturnus vulgaris) - Common.

American Pipit (Anthus rubescens) - Good looks at the Avra Valley Sewage Ponds, seen also at Santa Cruz Flats.

Waxwings, Silky-flycatchers, Olive Warbler, and Longspurs

Phainopepla (Phainopepla nitens) - A lovely bird, seen most days.

Olive Warbler (Peucedramus taeniatus) - Great looks at both a male and female up in the Catalinas at Rose Canyon.

Wood Warblers

Black-and-White Warbler (Mniotilta varia) - Seen at Catalina State Park.

Orange-crowned Warbler (Oreothlypis celata) - We saw a few of these at different places; the western variety seems brighter than we from the east are used to seeing.

Lucy's Warbler (Oreothlypis luciae) - A recent arrival, this bird was heard singing and also seen a few days.

Common Yellowthroat (Geothlypis trichas) - Heard at Sweetwater Wetlands, finally one seen at the GWR.

Yellow Warbler (Setophaga petechia) - One seen in the mesquite at the GWR.

Yellow-rumped (Audubon's) Warbler (Setophaga coronata) - Common and seen most days.

Black-throated Gray Warbler (Setophaga nigrescens) - Spotted by Andy at Sweetwater Wetlands, later seen at Catalina State Park.

Painted Redstart (Myioborus pictus) - Brief looks at a bird in the Catalinas at Bear Canyon; heard singing as well.

Emberizine Sparrows

Green-tailed Towhee (Pipilo chlorurus) - Finally seen our last day at Catalina SP.

Spotted Towhee (Pipilo maculatus) - Seen on days 3 & 4, our higher elevation days.

Canyon Towhee (Melozone fusca) - Good looks at this chunky bird at a few places, including Boyce Thompson Arboretum.

Abert's Towhee (Melazone aberti) - Seen frequenty, especially common at Sweetwater Wetlands. Rufous-winged Sparrow (Peucaea carpalis) - Had great looks at this bird right away as we got out of the car at the Desert Museum, it was singing in a small tree in the parking lot. Seen a few other times as well.

Black-chinned Sparrow (Spizella atrogularis) - A few of had brief looks at a couple of these on the way up to Kitt Peak.

Brewer's Sparrow (Spizella breweri) - This small, plain grassland bird was seen many days.

Chipping Sparrow (Spizella passerina) - Common in small flocks, seen most days.

Black-throated Sparrow (Amphispiza bilineata) - This lovely sparrow was first seen at the Desert Museum, also seen a few other places.

Savannah Sparrow (Passerculus sandwichensis) - Only a couple seen from the car at the Red Rocks Feedlot area.

Vesper Sparrow (Pooecetes gramineus) - A few seen, best looks on the last day at Catalina SP.

Song Sparrow (Melospiza melodia) - Seen most days, fun to hear the song differences.

Lincoln's Sparrow (Melospiza lincolnii) - This delicate sparrow was seen most days.

Dark-eyed Junco (Junco hyemalis) - Just a few of these seen, Oregon and Gray-headed varieties.

Yellow-eyed Junco (Junco phaeonotus) - This higher elevation bird was seen on our day up in the Catalinas.

White-crowned Sparrow (Zonotrichia leucophrys) - Seen almost everyday.

White-throated Sparrow (Zonotrichia albicollis) - This sparrow is uncommon in AZ, we saw on at Catalina SP.

Lark Bunting (Calamospiza melanocorys) - Large flocks of these were seen at the Red Rocks Feedlot.

Lark Sparrow (Chondestes grammacus)- Also seen in flocks at the Red Rocks Feedlot.

Cardinals

Northern Cardinal (Cardinalis cardinalis)- Surprisingly few of these were seen; Jane spotted nice male at the Desert Museum the first day.

Pyrrhuloxia (Cardinalis sinuatus) - Seen just a few times, best looks at Catalina SP.

Orioles & Blackbirds

Brewer's Blackbird (Euphagus cyanocephalus) - Large mixed flocks at the Red Rocks Feedlot.

Great-tailed Grackle (Quiscalus mexicanus) - Common and seen most days.

Red-winged Blackbird (Agelaius phoeniceus) - Large mixed flocks at the Red Rocks Feedlot, also at Sweetwater Wetlands.

Yellow-headed Blackbird (Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus - A few seen at Sweetwater Wetlands, also at Red Rocks Feedlot.

Brown-headed Cowbird (Molothrus ater) - Just a few seen at the feedlot.

Western Meadowlark (Sturnella neglecta) - Seen on our day around the Feedlot and the Santa Cruz Flats.

Baltimore Oriole (Icterus galbula) - An unusual visitor from the east, we saw a single male high in a cottonwood at Sweetwater Wetlands.

Finches & Allies

House Finch (Haemorhous mexicanus) - Common, seen daily.

Lesser Goldfinch (Spinus psaltria) - Seen most days.

House Sparrow (Passer domesticus) - Seen daily.
