



Yellowstone National Park: Birding & Wildlife Species List Sept 15– Sept 22, 2019 Compiled by Pat Lueders

(HO)= Distinctive enough to be counted as heard only (I)=introduced

BIRDS (92 species recorded, 1 guide only (GO), none were heard only):

DUCKS, GEESE AND SWANS: Anatidae (16)

Canada Goose Branta canadensis—Seen daily in good numbers at all locations Trumpeter Swan Cygnus buccinator—Largest number, 20, seen at Upper Lake at Red Rocks NWR Blue-winged Teal Spatula discors—Seen at Jackson Visitor Center & Red Rock Lake **Cinnamon Teal** Spatula cyanoptera—Scope views of a few at Red Rock Lake Gadwall Mareca strepera—Good numbers seen in Red Rock Lake American Wigeon Mareca americana—A few in Flat Creek in Jackson & many at Red Rock Lake Mallard Anas platyrhynchos—Seen daily at all locations with water Green-winged Teal Anas crecca—Close views at Jackson Visitor Center **Redhead** Aythya americana—One in Flat Creek & scope views of many at Red Rock Lake Ring-necked Duck Aythya collaris—Good study of juveniles & adults in Flat Creek; many at Red Rock Lesser Scaup Aythya affinis—Close looks at males & females in Flat Creek; also seen at Pelican Lake Harleguin Duck Histrionicus histrionicus—Watched a group of 3 feeding in the rapids at LeHardy Rapids Bufflehead Bucephala albeola—Seen at Henry's Lake & large numbers at Red Rock Lake Barrow's Goldeneye Bucephala islandica—Nice sized groups seen often in Yellowstone Lake Common Merganser Mergus merganser—Seen daily at all locations with water Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis—Seen often; including Flat Creek, Gull Point, & Henry Lake

GREBES: Podicipedidae (4)

Pied-billed Grebe *Podilymbus podiceps*—Only a few; 1 at Flat Creek, 1 at Floating Island Lake, 1 at Henry Lake

Red-necked Grebe *Podiceps grisegena*—Seen at Henry Lake; one still with a red neck at Harriman SP **Eared Grebe** *Podiceps nigricollis*—Hundreds covered Henry Lake at all visits!

Western Grebe *Aechmophorus occidentalis*—Nice study with close scope looks at a number of individuals at Henry Lake

PIGEONS AND DOVES: Columbidae (2)

Rock Pigeon *Columba livia* (I)—Few seen in town of West Yellowstone **Mourning Dove** *Zenaida macroura*—Seen around Henry Lake

RAILS, COOTS AND ALLIES: Rallidae (1)

American Coot Fulica americana—Wow! Too many to count in Henry Lake & Red Rock Lake

CRANES: Gruidae (1)

Sandhill Crane Antigone canadensis—Seen twice; a pair when leaving Henry Lake

PLOVERS AND LAPWINGS: Charadriidae (1)

Killdeer Charadrius vociferus—Seen on the shore of the Snake River at Harriman State Park

SANDPIPERS AND ALLIES: Scolopacidae (2)

Solitary Sandpiper *Tringa solitaria*—Close looks in the bay at Henry Lake **Lesser Yellowlegs** *Tringa flavipes*—Feeding close to group on shore of Red Rock Lake

GULLS AND TERNS: Laridae (4)

Bonaparte's Gull Chroicocephalus philadelphia—Scope views on water, then flying, at Henry Lake Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis—Seen flying and on the water at Henry Lake California Gull Larus californicus—A few seen at Henry Lake Forster's Tern Sterna forsteri—Great looks at one chasing & harassing the eagle at Henry Lake

LOONS: Gaviidae (1)

Common Loon *Gavia immer*—One greeted us near the shore when we arrived at Yellowstone Lake Hotel

CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae (1)

Double-crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus*—Seen often in Yellowstone Lake, Henry Lake, & Red Rock Lake

<u>PELICANS: Pelecanidae (1)</u> American White Pelican Pelecanus erythrorhynchos—Seen often, best at Harriman SP

HERONS AND EGRETS: Ardeidae (1) Great Blue Heron Ardea Herodias—Feeding at Henry Lake, Red Rock Lake & along the Snake River

NEW WORLD VULTURES: Cathartidae (1)

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura-Largest number seen over city of Jackson

OSPREY: Pandionidae (1)

Osprey Pandion haliaetus-Again, seen often over all lakes & rivers

HAWKS, KITES AND EAGLES: Accipitridae (8)

Golden Eagle Aquila chrysaetos—Seen soaring near nest in Lamar Valley & Red Rock Lake Northern Harrier Circus hudsonius—Spotted often over marsh areas including around Henry Lake Cooper's Hawk Accipiter cooperii—Seen soaring at Red Rock Lake

Bald Eagle *Haliaeetus leucocephalus*—Seen over Jackson the first day, later at Henry & Red Rock Lakes **Broad-winged Hawk** *Buteo platypterus*—A surprise sighting at Lewis Falls, migrating with Red-tail Hawks **Swainson's Hawk** *Buteo swainsoni*—Great looks at under wing pattern while soaring at Henry Lake **Red-tailed Hawk** *Buteo jamaicensis*—Seen daily, soaring or perched, at many locations

OWLS: Strigidae (1)

Great Gray Owl Strix nebulosa—VOTED BIRD OF THE TRIP -Seen at close range on hike at Lone Star Trail

KINGFISHERS: Alcedinidae (1)

Belted Kingfisher Megaceryle alcyon—Pair seen well over pond at Gull point

WOODPECKERS: Picidae (4)

Red-naped Sapsucker *Sphyrapicus nuchalis*—Our last new trip bird, seen during rest stop at Jackson Lake

Downy Woodpecker *Dryobates pubescens*—Flew onto a dead tree at Red Rock Lake campgrounds **Hairy Woodpecker** *Dryobates villosus*—Seen in a tree during stop at Idaho/Montana Continental Divide **Northern Flicker** *Colaptes auratus*—Red-shafted; seen & heard around Harriman State Park

FALCONS AND CARACARAS: Falconidae (2)

American Kestrel *Falco sparverius*—Few seen along the road & hovering during drive to Red Rock NWR **Peregrine Falcon** *Falco peregrinus*—(GO) Seen by Pat & Rick flying over the Old Faithful parking lot

CROWS AND JAYS: Corvidae (5)

Canada Jay *Perisoreus canadensis*—Seen in Lamar Valley, at Gibbon Falls & 3 at Continental Divide **Black-billed Magpie** *Pica hudsonia*—Seen almost daily; in good numbers near Red Rock Lake **Clark's Nutcracker** *Nucifraga columbiana*—Six sightings, best seen at Gibbon Falls along the cliff **American Crow** *Corvus brachyrhynchos*—Flocks found on the road to Red Rock NWR **Common Raven** *Corvus corax*—Common bird seen daily at all locations

TITS AND CHICKADEES: Paridae (2)

Black-capped Chickadee Poecile atricapillus—Seen well at Jackson Visitor Center & on visit to Red Rock NWR

Mountain Chickadee Poecile gambeli—Seen & heard almost daily at all locations

SWALLOWS AND MARTINS: Hirundinidae (2)

Tree Swallow *Tachycineta bicolor*—Good scope looks at one perched along Flat Creek **Barn Swallow** *Hirundo rustica*—Numerous individuals flying over Flat Creek & the marsh

KINGLETS: Regulidae (1)

Ruby-crowned Kinglet *Regulus calendula*—Good close looks at a number of individuals during walk at Madison Camp ground

NUTHATCHES: Sittidae (1)

Red-breasted Nuthatch Sitta canadensis—Great looks at two of this species on walk at Calcite Springs

CREEPERS: Certhiidae (1)

Brown Creeper Certhia americana—We found two near the end of our walk at LeHardy Rapids

WRENS: Troglodytidae (1)

Marsh Wren Cistothorus palustris—After hearing them vocalize, we stopped at Harriman SP along the lake and saw at least four vocalizing

DIPPERS: Cinclidae (1)

American Dipper Cinclus mexicanus—Another favorite species, we watched a very cooperative dipper feeding along the rocks at LeHardy Rapids

STARLINGS AND MYNAS: Sturnidae (1)

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris (I)—Seen on the utility lines near Anglers Lodge along the Snake River

THRUSHES: Turdidae (3)

Mountain Bluebird Sialia currucoides—This beautiful species was seen often including near Old Faithful Townsend's Solitaire Myadestes townsendi—Best looks at the top of trees on our visit to Norris Geyser American Robin Turdus migratorius—Seen often including LeHardy Rapids & Madison Campgrounds

WAXWINGS: Bombycillidae (1)

Cedar Waxwing Bombycilla cedrorum—Heard & seen often including at Jackson Visitor Center

FINCHES: Fringillidae (3)

Cassin's Finch Haemorhous cassinii—Seen best on visit to Harriman State park **Common Redpoll** Acanthis flammea—Seen perched by a few when we stopped at Old Faithful to watch the Covote

American Goldfinch Spinus tristis—Seen & heard while birding around Henry Lake

NEW WORLD SPARROWS: Passerellidae (8)

Chipping Sparrow Spizella passerina—Seen well at the sparrow stop along the road to Red Rock NWR Brewer's Sparrow Spizella breweri—Great looks at a pair on the road while birding at Henry Lake Dark-eyed Junco Junco hyemalis—Expected Pink-sided subspecies; seen often, first spotted under a bush at LeHardy Rapids, again at Madison Campgrounds

White-crowned Sparrow Zonotrichia leucophrys—Seen at sparrow stop & around Henry Lake Vesper Sparrow Pooecetes gramineus—Flash of white tail feathers from the road at Henry Lake Song Sparrow Melospiza melodia—Seen at sparrow stop on road to Red Rock NWR **Lincoln's Sparrow** Melospiza lincolnii—Two seen well in scope at sparrow stop on road to Red Rocks **Green-tailed Towhee** *Pipilo chlorurus*—Another popular sighting, good looks at two on the sparrow stop on the road to Red Rock NWR

NEW WORLD BLACKBIRDS: Icteridae (4)

Yellow-headed Blackbird Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus—Great looks at a number of individuals along Flat Creek in Jackson on top of the cattails and flying

Red-winged Blackbird Agelaius phoeniceus—With Yellow-headed along Flat Creek in cattails Brown-headed Cowbird Molothrus ater—Mixed in with flocks of Brewer's Blackbirds Brewer's Blackbird Euphagus cyanocephalus—Seen daily at all locations

NEW WORLD WARBLERS: Parulidae (3)

Nashville Warbler *Leiothlypis ruficapilla*—A surprise sighting of two while birding at Madison Campgrounds

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Yellow-rumped Warbler Setophaga coronata—Seen almost daily including at Pelican Valley Wilson's Warbler Cardellina pusilla—Good looks on our first day at Jackson Visitor Center

CARDINAL-GROSBEAKS: Cardinalidae (1)

Western Tanager Piranga ludoviciana—Found feeding on berries at our stop at Red Rock Lake

OLD WORLD SPARROWS: Passeridae (1)

House Sparrow Passer domesticus (I)—Seen in West Yellowstone parking lots

Mammals (13 species)

Pronghorn Antilocapra Americana—Seen often, best looks on road to Red Rock NWR
American Bison Bison bison—Seen daily in large numbers at all locations except Idaho
Moose Alces alces—Good sighting along the Snake River in Idaho of an adult female with juvenile
Elk Cervus elaphus—Nice sized herds seen in Hayden Valley and between Madison & West Yellowstone
Mule Deer Odocoileus hemionus—Spotted in the woods on trip to Gull Point
Coyote Canis latrans—Out in the open on road from Old Faithful
Gray Wolf Canis lupus—VOTED THE #1 EXPERIENCE! What great luck to be in Lamar Valley & watch a pack of Gray Wolves feeding on a Bison
American Badger Taxidea taxus—After leaving Red Rock Lake, one was spotted in a field along the road
American Black Bear Ursus americanus—Near Tower Falls, we stopped to watch a Black Bear close to the road
Least Chipmunk Tamias minimus—Seen well at most locations, especially around geysers

American Red Squirrel Tamiasciurus hudsonicus—Seen & heard daily at all locations

Common Muskrat *Ondatra zibethicus*—Seen swimming near the bank of the Snake River from Antlers Lodge in Idaho

Bat sp.—Small, unidentified deceased bat found at our lunch stop at Red Rock Lake
