# BIRDS (104 species recorded, 12 HO and 4 GO):

# **DUCKS, GEESE AND SWANS: Anatidae**

Canada Goose Branta Canadensis—(4) Seen most days

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos—(1) Seen once, with ducklings, on the Lost Pond trail

Common Eider Somateria mollissima—(2) Crescent Beach and Portland waterfront

Common Merganser Mergus merganser—(1) GO in the Pudding Pond area

# **PIGEONS AND DOVES: Columbidae**

**Rock Pigeon (I)** *Columba livia*—(1) Only seen in urban Portland **Mourning Dove** *Zenaida macroura*—(3) Various locations

#### **CUCKOOS: Cuculidae**

Black-billed Cuckoo coccyzus erythropthalmus—(1) On bird seen well at Dahl Bird Sanctuary

## **SWIFTS: Apodidae**

**Chimney Swift** Chaetura pelagica—(4) See and heard daily in and around the Glen House

# **HUMMINGBIRDS: Trochilidae**

Ruby-throated Hummingbird Archilochus colubris—(1) Seen only once at Glen House

#### **PLOVERS AND LAPWINGS: Charadriidae**

**Piping Plover** Charadrius melodus—(1) Great looks at nesting birds at Crescent Beach **Killdeer** Charadrius vociferous—(1) Also seen at Crescent Beach

# **SANDPIPERS AND ALLIES: Scolopacidae**

**Spotted Sandpiper** *Actitis macularius*—(1) Along the muddy banks of the Nonesuch River at Scarborough Marsh

Willet Tringa semipalmata—(1) Seen and heard at Scarborough Marsh

# **GULLS AND TERNS: Laridae**

Herring Gull Larus argentatus—(2) Portland waterfront and Crescent Beach Great Black-backed Gull Larus marinus—(2) Portland waterfront and Crescent Beach Least Tern Sternula antillarum—(1) Seen well at Crescent Beach Common Tern Sterna hirundo—(2) Portland waterfront and Crescent Beach

### **LOONS:** Gaviidae

Common Loon Gavia immer—(1) Beyond the waves at Crescent Beach

## **CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae**

**Double-crested Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax auritus*—(2) Portland waterfront and Crescent Beach

# **HERONS AND EGRETS: Ardeidae**

**Great Egret** Ardea alba—(1) Scarborough Marsh **Snowy Egret** Egretta thula—(1) Scarborough Marsh **Tricolored Heron** Egretta tricolor—(1) Scarborough Marsh

# IBIS AND SPOONBILLS: Threskiornithidae

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus—(1) Scarborough Marsh

### **NEW WORLD VULTURES: Cathartidae**

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura—(3) Peabody River an around Mt. Washington

## **OSPREY: Pandionidae**

Osprey Pandion haliaetus—(2) Nest in urban Portland, also at Crescent Beach

## HAWKS, KITES, AND EAGLES: Accipitridae

Northern Goshawk Accipiter gentilis—(1) Seen flying around the Mt. Washington Auto Tour Bald Eagle Haliaeetus leucocephalus—(1) Flyover at Crescent Beach Broad-winged Hawk Buteo platypterus—(3) Seen the last three days around the Glen House Red-tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis—(1) Mt. Washington Red-shouldered Hawk Buteo lineatus—(1) Seen on the last day at Mt. Washington

# **OWLS: Strigidae**

Barred Owl Strix varia—(1) HO at Pinkham B Road

# **KINGFISHERS: Alcedinidae**

**Belted Kingfisher** *Megaceryle alcyon*—(1) Lost Pond Trail

# **WOODPECKERS: Picidae**

**Yellow-bellied Sapsucker** *Sphyrapicus varius*—(3) Nest and courtship behavior along Dolly Copp Road, also on Mt. Washington

Red-bellied Woodpecker Melanerpes carolinus—(1) GO/HO at Scarborough Marsh

**Hairy Woodpecker** *Dryobates villosus*—(1) Pinkham B Road **Northern Flicker** *Colaptes auratus*—(1) Once at the Glen House

# **FALCONS AND CARACARAS: Falconidae**

Merlin Falco columbarius—(1) GO at Glen House

# **TYRANT FLYCATCHERS: Tyrannidae**

Eastern Wood-Pewee Contopus virens—(1) HO along Dolly Copp Rd

Yellow-bellied Flycatcher Empidonax flaviventris—(3) HO twice then finally seen well on Mt.

Washington Auto Road

Alder Flycatcher Empidonax alnorum—(2) Glen House trails

Eastern Phoebe Sayornis phoebe—(2) Glen House trails

Eastern Kingbird Tyrannus tyrannus—(1) Lost Pond Trail

## **VIREOS: Vireonidae**

Blue-headed Vireo Vireo solitarius—(3) HO almost daily in Mt Washington area

Philadelphia Vireo Vireo philadelphicus—(1) Seen well at Wildcat Ski Area

Warbling Vireo Vireo gilvus—(1) HO at Pinkham Notch

Red-eyed Vireo Vireo olivaceus—(4) Seen and heard almost daily in the Mt. Washington area

#### **CROWS AND JAYS: Corvidae**

Canada Jay Perisoreus Canadensis—(1) Mt. Washington Auto Tour

Blue Jay Cyanocitta cristata—(4) Seen or heard daily in the Mt. Washington area

American Crow Corvus brachyrhynchos—(6) Conspicuous throughout

Common Raven Corvus corax—(2) Mt. Washington Auto Tour

# **TITS AND CHICKADEES: Paridae**

Black-capped Chickadee Poecile atricapillus—(4) Nest at Songo Lock, then carrying food at Glen House

Boreal Chickadee Poecile hudsonicus—(2) Mt. Washington Auto Road

**Tufted Titmouse** *Baeolophus bicolor*—(1) Scarborough Marsh

## **SWALLOWS AND MARTINS: Hirundinidae**

**Tree Swallow** *Tachycineta bicolor*—(2) Nesting in boxes on Glen House trails

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica—(1) Pudding Pond area

# **KINGLETS: Regulidae**

Golden-crowned Kinglet Regulus satrapa—(2) Seen on Dolly Copp Rd, HO elsewhere

Ruby-crowned Kinglet Regulus calendula—(2) Territorial birds found along Mt. Washington Auto Road

#### **NUTHATCHES: Sittidae**

Red-breasted Nuthatch Sitta Canadensis—(2) HO on Dolly Copp Rd, seen at Glen House

White-breasted Nuthatch Sitta carolinensis—(1) HO at Glen House trails

#### TREECREEPERS: Certhiidae

Brown Creeper Certhia Americana—(1) HO on Mt. Washington Auto Road

# **WRENS: Troglodytidae**

House Wren Troglodytes aedon—(2) HO along country road

Winter Wren Troglodytes hiemalis—(2) HO twice in Mt. Washington area

## **STARLINGS AND MYNAS: Sturndae**

**European Starling (I):** Sturnus vulgaris—(3) Found only in urban and suburban areas

# **MOCKINGBIRDS AND THRASHERS: Mimidae**

Gray Catbird Dumetella carolinensis—(1) Dahl Sanctuary

# **THRUSHES: Turdidae**

Eastern Bluebird Sialia sialis—(1) Active nest box at Glen House trails

**Wood Thrush** *Hylocichla mustelina*—(1) HO along Dolly Copp Rd.

Bicknell's Thrush Catharus bicknelli—(2) Seen well and then many heard along Mt. Washington Auto Rd.

Swainson's Thrush Catharus ustulatus—(4) HO in various locations around Mt. Washington

Hermit Thrush Catharus guttatus—(2) HO along Mt. Washington Auto Tour

American Robin Turdus migratorius—(4) Almost daily in mountain habitats

#### **PIPITS: Moticillidae**

Amercan Pipit Anthus rubescens—(Seen well in the tundra along Mt. Washington Auto Rd.

### **WAXWINGS: Bombycillidae**

Cedar Waxwing Bombycilla cedrorum—(5) Crescent Beach, Songo Lock, and Mt. Washington area

#### **OLD WORLD SPARROWS: Passeridae**

House Sparrow (I) Passer domesticus—(3) Seen only in urban and suburban areas

## FINCHES AND EUPHONIAS: Fringillidae

House Finch Haemorhous mexicanus—(1) Around the Hampton Inn

Purple Finch Haemorhous purpureus—(3) HO twice and then seen along Mt. Washington Auto Tour

Red Crossbill Loxia curvirostra—(1) GO at Glen House

Pine Siskin Spinus pinus—(1) Seen only once at Glen House

American Goldfinch Spinus tristis—(2) Suburban Portland and Glen House

# **NEW WORLD SPARROWS: Passerellidae**

Chipping Sparrow Spizella passerine—(5) Daily in the mountains, nesting at Glen House Dark-eyed Junco Junco hyemalis—(3) Mostly along Mt. Washington Road White-throated Sparrow Zonotrichia albicollis—(3) Mostly along Mt. Washington Road Saltmarsh Sparrow Ammospiza caudacuta—(1) Seen well at Scarborough Marsh

**Song Sparrow** *Melospiza melodia*—(3) Frequently seen in riparian and marsh areas **Swamp Sparrow** *Melospiza georgiana*—(2) Lost Pond trail and Glen House trails

### **NEW WORLD BLACKBIRDS: Icteridae**

**Red-winged Blackbird** *Agelaius phoeniceus*—(4) Almost daily in and around Glen House **Common Grackle** *Quiscalus quiscula*—(4) Mostly in urban and suburban areas

# **NEW WORLD WARBLERS: Parulidae**

**Ovenbird** Seiurus aurocapilla—(4) HO 3 days, seen on Pinkham B Rd. **Black-and-white Warbler** *Mniotilta* varia—(3) HO twice, seen at Glen House trails **Nashville Warbler** *Leiothlypis* ruficapilla—(1) Mt. Washington Auto Rd.

Common Yellowthroat Geothlypis trichas—(5) Scarborough Marsh and throughout wet areas

American Redstart Setophaga ruticilla—(5) Songo Lock and most woodland areas

Northern Parula Setophaga Americana—(2) Glen House trails

Magnolia Warbler Setophaga magnolia—(3) HO three times in mountain woodlands

Blackburnian Warbler Setophaga fusca—(3) Seen well at Pudding Pond, Glen House, and Dolly Copp

Yellow Warbler Setophaga petechial—(1) Songo Lock

Chestnut-sided Warbler Setophaga pensylvanica—(3) Regular on Glen House trails

Blackpoll Warbler Setophaga striata—(2) Common along Mt. Washington Auto Rd.

Black-throated Blue Warbler Setophaga caerulescens—(3) Seen well at Pudding Pond and Dolly Copp

Pine Warbler Setophaga pinus—(1) Only once at Pudding Pond Conservation Area

Yellow-rumped Warbler Setophaga coronate—(4) Common in mountain woodlands

Black-throated Green Warbler Setophaga virens—(3) Fairly common in mountain woodlands

## CARDINALS, GROSBEAKS, AND ALLIES: Cardinalidae

Scarlet Tanager Piranga olivacea—(1) One male seen along Mt. Washington Auto Tour Northern Cardinal Cardinalis cardinalis—(1) Seen only once at Dahl Sanctuary Indigo Bunting Passerina cyanea—(3) Regular around the Glen House

### **MAMMALS**

Eastern Chipmunk Tamias striatus—(3) Regular around Glen House
Eastern Gray Squirrel Sciurus carolinensis—(1) Once at Dahl Sanctuary
Eastern Red Squirrel Tamiasciurus hudsonicus—(2) Seen in mountain woodlands

## **REPTILES AND AMPHIBIANS**

American Toad Bufo americanus—(1) Glen House trails

Spring Peeper Pseudacris crucifer—(2) HO twice around Glen House

Northern Gray Treefrog Hyla versicolor—(1) Dahl Sanctuary

Green Frog Rana clamitans—(1) Lost Pond Trail

Eastern Garter Snake Thamnophis sirtalis—(1) Glen House trails
