Six days of birding, day seven departure day

DUCKS, GEESE, AND SWANS: Anatidae

Snow Goose *Anser caerulescens* – Thousands observed on 4 days. Five Blue Morph birds were observed at the Sac NWR

Ross's Goose Chen rossii - 20 at Colusa NWR

Greater White-fronted Goose *Anser albifrons* – Thousands observed on 5 days. Eight "Tule Goose" race were well observed at the Colusa NWR was a highlight.

Cackling Goose *Branta hutchinsii* – Thousands observed at known wintering locations on Woodbridge Rd and Staten Island. All were Aleutian race.

Canada Goose Branta Canadensis – Small numbers on 3 days

Tundra Swan Cygnus columbianus - Hundreds on 5 days. We never tired of seeing them. Majestic!

Wood Duck *Aix sponsa* – Small numbers at Louis Park in Stockton

Cinnamon Teal Anas cyanoptera – Seven at Colusa NWR

Northern Shoveler Spatula clypeata – Hundreds observed on 5 days

Gadwall Mareca strepera – Good numbers on 4 days

American Wigeon Mareca americana – Very good numbers on all days

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos – Good numbers on all days

Northern Pintail Anas acuta – Hundreds on 5 days

Green-winged Teal Anas crecca – 100 at the Colusa NWR

Canvasback Aythya valisineria – Good numbers on Woodbridge Rd and Staten Island

Ring-necked Duck Aythya collaris – Good numbers on 3 days

Greater Scaup Aythya marila – a few at the Lodi Water Treatment Plant were a surprise

Lesser Scaup Aythya affinis – Good numbers at the Lodi Water Treatment Plant

Bufflehead Bucephala albeola – Small numbers on 3 days

Common Goldeneye Bucephala clangula – Small numbers on 3 days

Barrow's Goldeneye Bucephala islandica – A female at the Fish Hatchery was a rarity

Hooded Merganser *Lophodytes cucullatus* – 25 near the Fish Hatchery

Common Merganser *Mergus merganser* – three at the Fish Hatchery

Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis – Small numbers on 2 days

NEW WORLD QUAIL: Odontophoridae

California Quail Callipepla californica – Heard twice and one good sighting (whew!)

Wild Turkey Meleagris gallopavo – Two sightings

Pied-billed Grebe Podilymbus podiceps – Small numbers on 3 days

PIGEONS AND DOVES: Columbidae

Rock Pigeon Columba livia – Every day

Eurasian Collared-Dove Streptopelia decaocto – Good numbers every day

Mourning Dove Zenaida macroura – Small numbers every day

HUMMINGBIRDS: Trochilidae

Anna's Hummingbird Calypte anna – 15 at Heritage Oak Winery and a few at Lodi Lake

RAILS, COOTS, AND ALLIES: Rallidae

Virginia Rail Rallus limicola – Heard at Colusa NWR

Sora *Porzana carolina* – Well observed at Colusa NWR

Common Gallinule *Gallinula* – 10 at Colusa NWR

American Coot Fulica americana – Good numbers on 4 days

CRANES: Gruidae

Sandhill Crane Grus canadensis – Good numbers on 4 days were always enjoyed by all

STILTS AND AVOCETS: Recurvirostridae

Black-necked Stilt Himantopus mexicanus – Good numbers on 4 days

American Avocet Recurvirostra americana – 20 staked out in flooded field near the airport on day 1

PLOVERS AND LAPWINGS: Charadriidae

Killdeer Charadrius vociferus – Good numbers everyday

SANDPIPERS AND ALLIES: Scolopacidae

Long-billed Curlew Numenius americanus – Small numbers on 2 days

Dunlin Calidris alpina – Good number on 2 days

Long-billed Dowitcher *Limnodromus scolopaceus* – Good numbers on 3 days

Wilson's Snipe Gallinago delicata – one at the Colusa NWR

Spotted Sandpiper *Actitis macularius* – one at the Fish Hatchery

Greater Yellowlegs Tringa melanoleuca – Good numbers on 5 days

Lesser Yellowlegs *Tringa flavipes* – Seven on Staten Island was a nice total

GULLS AND TERNS: Laridae

Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis – Good numbers on 5 days

California Gull Larus californicus – Small number on 3 days

Herring Gull Larus argentatus – Good numbers on 5 days

Iceland Gull Larus glaucoides - Two in flooded field near Davis; Thayer's race

Glaucous-winged Gull Larus glaucescens – One in flooded field near Davis

CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae

Double-crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus* – Good numbers on 5 days

PELICANS: Pelecanidae

American White Pelican Pelecanus erythrorhynchos – About 40 on Staten Island

HERONS AND EGRETS: Ardeidae

Great Blue Heron *Ardea Herodias* – Small numbers every day **Great Egret** *Ardea alba* – Good numbers every day **Snowy Egret** *Egretta thula* – A few on 3 days

IBIS AND SPOONBILLS: Threskiornithidae

White-faced Ibis Plegadis chihi – About 30 in flooded fields near Davis

NEW WORLD VULTURES: Cathartidae

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura – Good numbers on 5 days

OSPREY: Pandionidae

Osprey Pandion haliaetus – Two

HAWKS, KITES, AND EAGLES: Accipitridae

White-tailed Kite Elanus leucurus – Seven over 3 days
Northern Harrier Circus hudsonius – Small numbers on 4 days
Sharp-shinned Hawk Accipiter striatus – one at Lodi Lake
Cooper's Hawk Accipiter cooperii – Single birds on 4 days
Bald Eagle Haliaeetus leucocephalus - One in flooded fields near Davis
Red-shouldered Hawk Buteo lineatus – Small numbers every day
Red-tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis – Good numbers every day
Ferruginous Hawk Buteo regalis – About six over 3 days were exciting

OWLS: Strigidae

Great Horned Owl Bubo virginianus – Four at the refuges

KINGFISHERS: Alcedinidae

Belted Kingfisher Megaceryle alcyon – 4 over days

WOODPECKERS: Picidae

Lewis's Woodpecker *Melanerpes lewis* – Small numbers over 3 days **Acorn Woodpecker** *Melanerpes formicivorus* – Small numbers on 2 days **Downy Woodpecker** *Dryobates pubescens* – Small numbers on 4 days **Northern Flicker** *Colaptes auratus* – Small numbers on 3 days

FALCONS AND CARACRAS: Falconidae

American Kestrel Falco sparverius - Good numbers every day
Merlin Falco columbarius – Two on two days
Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus – Two on two days
Prairie Falcon Falco mexicanus – Two on two days

TYRANT FLYCATCHERS: Tyrannidae

Black Phoebe *Sayornis nigricans* – Small numbers every day **Say's Phoebe** *Sayornis saya* – Seven over 4 days

VIREOS: Vireonidae

Hutton's Vireo Vireo huttoni – Heard at Lodi Lake

SHRIKES: Laniidae

Loggerhead Shrike Lanius Iudovicianus – Three over 2 days

CROWS AND JAYS: Corvidae

California Scrub-Jay *Aphelocoma californica* – Good numbers on 4 days **Yellow-billed Magpie** *Pica nuttalli*– About 40 birds over 2 days **American Crow** *Corvus brachyrhynchos* – Big numbers on 5 days **Common Raven** *Corvus corax* – Small numbers on 3 days

TITS AND CHICKADEES: Paridae

Oak Titmouse Baeolophus inornatus – Small number on 3 days

LARKS: Alaudidae

Horned Lark Eremophila alpestris – About 25 in grasslands east of Linden

SWALLOWS AND MARTINS: Hirundinidae

Tree Swallow Tachycineta bicolor - Hundreds on Woodbridge Rd and Staten Island

LONG-TAILED TITS: Aegithalidae

Bushtit Psaltriparus minimus – Good numbers on 3 days

KINGLETS: Regulidae

Ruby-crowned Kinglet Corthylio calendula – Good numbers on 5 days

NUTHATCHES: Sittidae

White-breasted Nuthatch Sitta carolinensis – Eight over 2 days

GNATCATCHER: Polioptilidae

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher Polioptila caerulea – One at the Fish Hatchery

WRENS: Troglodytidae

Rock Wren Salpinctes obsoletus – One near the refuges **House Wren** Troglodytes aedon – Two at Lodi Lake **Marsh Wren** Cistothorus palustris – Eight over 3 days

STARLINGS AND MYNAS: Sturnidae

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris – Good numbers every day

MOCKINGBIRDS AND THRASHERS: Mimidae

California Thrasher *Toxostoma redivivum* – Two over 2 days **Northern Mockingbird** *Mimus polyglottos* – Small numbers over 5 days

THRUSHES: Turdidae

Western Bluebird Sialia mexicana – Small numbers over 3 days Hermit Thrush Catharus guttatus – Eleven over 2 days American Robin Turdus migratorius – Good numbers every day

WAXWINGS: Bombycillidae

Cedar Waxwing Bombycilla cedrorum – Small numbers over 4 days

OLD WORLD SPARROWS: Passeridae

House Sparrow Passer domesticus – Good numbers over 3 days

PIPITS AND WAGTAILS: Motacillidae

American Pipit Anthus rubescens – Small numbers over 5 days

FINCHES AND EUPHONIAS: Fringillidae

House Finch *Haemorhous mexicanus* – Small numbers over 5 days **Pine Siskin** *Spinus pinus* – A few heard at Lodi Lake **Lesser Goldfinch** *Spinus psaltria* – Ten at Lodi Lake **American Goldfinch** *Spinus tristis* – 20 over 2 days

NEW WORLD SPARROWS: Passerellidae

Lark Sparrow Chondestes grammacus – 50 at the one of the wineries

Fox Sparrow Passerella iliaca – Five ate Lodi Lake

Dark-eyed Junco Junco hyemalis – 40 over 2 days; Oregon types with one Slate-colored

White-crowned Sparrow Zonotrichia leucophrys – Good numbers everyday

Golden-crowned Sparrow Zonotrichia atricapilla – Small numbers on 5 days

White-throated Sparrow Zonotrichia albicollis – one at Lodi Lake

Savannah Sparrow Passerculus sandwichensis – Good numbers on 4 days

Chipping Sparrow Spizella passerina – Six over 2 days was a surprise

Song Sparrow Melospiza melodia – Small numbers over 4 days

Lincoln's Sparrow Melospiza lincolnii – 20 over 4 days

California Towhee Melozone crissalis – 16 over 3 days

Spotted Towhee *Pipilo maculatus* – 15 over 2 days

NEW WORLD BLACKBIRDS: Icteridae

Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta – Good numbers over 5 days

Red-winged Blackbird Agelaius phoeniceus – Hundreds over 5 days; Bicolored race

Tricolored Blackbird Agelaius tricolor – Around 50 over 2 days

Brown-headed Cowbird Molothrus ater – 10 on one day

Brewer's Blackbird Euphagus cyanocephalus – Big numbers every day

Great-tailed Grackle Quiscalus mexicanus – Ten at the Lodi WTP

NEW WORLD WARBLERS: Parulidae

Orange-crowned Warbler *Oreothlypis celata* – Nine over 3 days

Common Yellowthroat *Geothlypis trichas* – Three over 2 days

Yellow-rumped Warbler Setophaga coronate – Good numbers over 5 day; one Myrtle

Townsend's Warbler *Setophaga townsendi* – Two in city parks

Eastern Fox Squirrel *Sciurus niger* – 3 days
