Utah: Birding & National Parks | Species List May 16 – 24, 2022 | with Naturalist Journeys

Summary: This tour featured a very nice combination of spectacular canyon country scenery in some of our most well-known national parks and birding and wildlife-watching at and in between these places. The weather varied greatly depending on location, elevation, and the particular day, with temperature extremes during the trip ranging from 25 to 105° F! Although there were many highlights (and many life birds!), a few to mention (in taxonomic order) include a breeding plumaged Common Loon at Jackson Flat Reservoir, some close-range observations of the unique powder blue-colored bill of male Ruddy Ducks, Pinyon Jays feeding on tent caterpillars, a Brown-headed Nuthatch nest, and Yellow Warblers galore. On the flip side, it was very curious and notable the lack of raptors (only 2 species and very few individuals) and wrens.

BIRDS (101 species recorded, of which 6 were seen by guides only):

LOONS: Gaviidae (1)

Common Loon Gavia immer—A breeding plumaged bird seen by all at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the first visit

DUCKS, GEESE AND SWANS: Anatidae (9)

Canada Goose *Branta canadensis*—Found on 4 days of the tour in many places with suitable water bodies; at a few places, adult pairs were with groups of goslings.

Cinnamon Teal Spatula cyanoptera—One male seen on the second visit to Jackson Flat Reservoir

Gadwall Mareca strepera—Found on both visits to Jackson Flat Reservoir

American Wigeon Mareca americana—Found on the second visit to Jackson Flat Reservoir

Mallard *Anas platyrhynchos*—The most frequently encountered waterfowl species, these were found on 5 days at most suitable sites with bodies of water

Redhead Aythya americana—Found by Dave on the first visit and then by the group on the second visit to Jackson Flat Reservoir

Ring-necked Duck Aythya collaris—Found on both visits to Jackson Flat Reservoir

Lesser Scaup Aythya affinis—(GO) Found by Dave with the scope at Jackson Flat Reservoir

Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis—One male in the pond at Ruby's Inn (Bryce Canyon City) on 2 days and several individuals in the pond behind Boulder Mountain Lodge

NEW WORLD QUAIL: Odontophoridae (1)

Gambel's Quail Callipepla gambelii—Found at Grafton

PARTRIDGES, PHEASANTS AND ALLIES: Phasianidae (1)

Wild Turkey Meleagris gallopavo—Found on 3 days, probably best at Capitol Reef National Park

GREBES: Podicipedidae (3)

Pied-billed Grebe Podilymbus podiceps—Found on both visits to Jackson Flat Reservoir

Eared Grebe Podiceps nigricollis—Found with the aid of the scope on both visits to Jackson Flat Reservoir

Western/Clark's Grebe *Aechmophorus occidentalis/clarkii*—One found at a distance at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the second visit; too far to separate the two species

PIGEONS AND DOVES: Columbidae (3)

Rock Pigeon *Columba livia* (I)—Seen in Las Vegas when departing for Springdale!

Eurasian Collared-Dove *Streptopelia decaocto* (I)—Found on at least 4 days of the tour when in lower elevation towns **Mourning Dove** *Zenaida macroura*—Seen at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the second visit

SWIFTS: Apodidae (1)

White-throated Swift Aeronautes saxatalis—Found on 4 days of the trip, often seen at canyon sites while flying past, sometimes at or below eye level

HUMMINGBIRDS: Trochilidae (1)

Black-chinned Hummingbird Archilochus alexandri—Found on 3 days at various sites with feeders

RAILS, COOTS AND ALLIES: Rallidae (1)

American Coot *Fulica americana*—Found on 4 days at most sites with appropriate water bodies, such as Jackson Flat Reservoir

STILTS AND AVOCETS: Recurvirostridae (2)

Black-necked Stilt *Himantopus mexicanus*—Several birds observed at a distance foraging at the edge of Jackson Flat Reservoir on the first visit

American Avocet Recurvirostra americana—A group of 4 seen standing in the water near the lunch pavilion at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the first visit

PLOVERS AND LAPWINGS: Charadriidae (1)

Killdeer Charadrius vociferus—(GO) Only seen by Dave on the last morning at Ruby's Inn

SANDPIPERS AND ALLIES: Scolopacidae (2)

Phalarope spp.—A very distant flock of phalaropes seen out on the water at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the first visit; too distant to tell if Wilson's or Red-necked or both

Spotted Sandpiper *Actitis macularius*—By far the most numerous and frequently seen shorebird of the tour, it was present around the edges of most lakes we visited; seen on 5 days, including once in the Fremont River at Capitol Reef National Park on a rock

GULLS AND TERNS: Laridae (2)

Bonaparte's Gull *Chroicocephalus philadelphia*—One found on the shore at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the second visit **California Gull** *Larus californicus*—Seen hanging out by the boat ramp on the first visit to Jackson Flat Reservoir

CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae (1)

Double-crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus*—Several seen perched in trees on the first visit to Jackson Flat Reservoir

HERONS AND EGRETS: Ardeidae (2)

Great Blue Heron *Ardea herodias*—Seen by Dave in the Virgin River at Zion National Park and again by the entire group at Grafton, where many individuals were flying overhead, probably from a heronry

Great Egret Ardea alba—One seen at a distance with the scope on the first visit to Jackson Flat Reservoir

IBIS AND SPOONBILLS: Threskiornithidae (1)

White-faced Ibis *Plegadis chihi*—Good sized flocks seen on both visits to Jackson Flat Reservoir; on the second day the flock was feeding in an irrigated hay field by the entrance road

NEW WORLD VULTURES: Cathartidae (1)

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura—Found on 6 days at many sites while soaring

HAWKS, KITES AND EAGLES: Accipitridae (1)

Red-tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis—Seen on 2 days, first at Zion National Park and then again at Grafton

WOODPECKERS: Picidae (2)

Hairy Woodpecker Dryobates villosus—One flew by the group at Grafton

Northern Flicker *Colaptes auratus*—Several individuals put on quite a show, including sitting on the ground, at Fruita in Capitol Reef National Park

FALCONS AND CARACARAS: Falconidae (1)

American Kestrel Falco sparverius—One seen at Grafton

TYRANT FLYCATCHERS: Tyrannidae (9)

Western Wood Pewee Contopus sordidulus—Seen once at Bryce Canyon and again at Calf Creek Recreation Area Hammond's Flycatcher Empidonax hammondii—One found during the walk on the interpretive trail at Red Canyon Visitor Center

Cordilleran Flycatcher *Empidonax occidentalis*—A very nice view of this difficult to identify species was had at Fruita in the picnic area

Black Phoebe Sayornis nigricans—Seen along the Virgin River in Zion National Park

Say's Phoebe Sayornis saya—Seen at Grafton and at Jackson Flat Reservoir

Vermilion Flycatcher *Pyrocephalus rubinus*—Male and female seen at Grafton

Ash-throated Flycatcher Myiarchus cinerascens—Seen on two days in various parts of Zion National Park

Cassin's Kingbird Tyrannus vociferans—(GO) One seen flying at Grafton by Dave

Western Kingbird Tyrannus verticalis—Seen on 5 days at several sites

VIREOS: Vireonidae (2)

Plumbeous Vireo *Vireo plumbeus*—Two well observed foraging in cottonwoods in Capitol Reef National Park at the Petroglyphs stop

Warbling Vireo Vireo gilvus—Found at Zion National Park on the walk between stops along the Virgin River

SHRIKES: Laniidae (1)

Loggerhead Shrike *Lanius Iudovicianus*—One nicely perching bird at the entrance to the upper Grand Wash trailhead in Capitol Reef National Park

CROWS AND JAYS: Corvidae (6)

Pinyon Jay *Gymnorhinus cyanocephalus*—Seen on 2 days, first at the La Quinta in Springdale and then again at Fruita, where a large flock was feeding on tent caterpillars in the cottonwoods

Steller's Jay *Cyanocitta stelleri*—Found on 3 days at high elevations at the North Rim of Grand Canyon and in Bryce Canyon

Woodhouse's Scrub-Jay *Aphelocoma woodhouseii*—Seen once by Dave in Sprindale by the La Quinta, by most of the group at the Stone Hearth Grille in Tropic, and finally at Calf Creek Recreation Area

Black-billed Magpie Pica hudsonia—Seen on 2 days at Boulder Mountain Lodge and at Capitol Reef Resort

Clark's Nutcracker Nucifraga columbiana—Seen on 2 days at Bryce when along the rim

Common Raven Corvus corax—Found on all 7 days of the trip, pretty much at every site visited

TITS AND CHICKADEES: Paridae (1)

Mountain Chickadee Poecile gambeli—Seen on the Bristlecone Loop trail hike at Bryce Canyon

SWALLOWS AND MARTINS: Hirundinidae (4)

Northern Rough-winged Swallow *Stelgidopteryx serripennis*—(GO) Seen by Dave flying over the pond at Ruby's Inn on the first evening there

Violet-green Swallow Tachycineta thalassina—Found on 5 days of the tour at most higher elevation sites

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica—Found on all three days near Ruby's Inn

Cliff Swallow Petrochelidon pyrrhonota—(GO) Seen by Dave while driving to Kanab from Springdale

NUTHATCHES: Sittidae (2)

White-breasted Nuthatch *Sitta carolinensis*—Seen once by Dave near the east entrance to Zion and by the group on the Bristlecone Loop trail at Bryce

Pygmy Nuthatch *Sitta pygmaea*—One of the stars of the trip, Raj found a nest on the North Rim and the group saw it again on the Mossy Cave hike at Bryce

GNATCATCHERS: Polioptilidae (1)

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher Polioptila caerulea—Seen twice during our time at Capitol Reef National Park

WRENS: Troglodytidae (2)

House Wren *Troglodytes aedon*—Encountered a few times when in Zion National Park **Bewick's Wren** *Thryomanes bewickii*—One heard singing at Grafton

STARLINGS AND MYNAS: Sturnidae (1)

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris (I)—Found on 3 days of the tour when in towns or near human habitation

MOCKINGBIRDS AND THRASHERS: Mimidae (1)

Northern Mockingbird Mimus polyglottos—Seen at Grafton

THRUSHES: Turdidae (3)

Western Bluebird Sialia mexicana—Found on 4 days of the tour in Zion, Grafton, and Bryce Canyon

Townsend's Solitaire *Myadestes townsendi*—A pair very well seen by some in the group when drinking from a leaky water pipe at Bryce Canyon

American Robin Turdus migratorius—Found on every day of the tour at most sites, often on grass lawns near our hotels

SILKY-FLYCATCHERS: Ptiliogonatidae (1)

Phainopepla Phainopepla nitens—Several individuals of both sexes seen well at Grafton

OLD WORLD SPARROWS: Passeridae (1)

House Sparrow Passer domesticus (I)—Found on 6 days of the tour in and near towns

FINCHES: Fringillidae (4)

House Finch Haemorhous mexicanus—Found on 4 days of the tour, generally in or near towns at lower elevations

Cassin's Finch Haemorhous cassinii—Both sexes observed at close range at Jacob Lake Inn

Pine Siskin *Spinus* pinus—Found twice, first at Jacob Lake Inn and again at Ruby's Inn (not sure about the connection between Inns and Siskins, but we'll investigate!)

Lesser Goldfinch *Spinus psaltria*—Found at Zion on 2 days, but by far the best viewing was at the feeder at Calf Creek Recreation Area

NEW WORLD SPARROWS: Passerellidae (8)

Chipping Sparrow *Spizella passerina*—This normally quite common species was only found at the rest stop near the east entrance to Zion on the way out of the park

Brewer's Sparrow Spizella breweri—Found in the sagebrush at Jackson Lake Reservoir on both visits

Lark Sparrow Chondestes grammacus—Excellent views of a perching bird at Grafton

Dark-eyed Junco *Junco hyemalis*—Several individuals of the Gray-headed form seen at the North Rim, Grand Canyon National Park

White-crowned Sparrow Zonotrichia leucophrys—Seen at Calf Creek Recreation Area

Song Sparrow Melospiza melodia—Decent views of this sparrow were had along the Virgin River at Zion

Green-tailed Towhee Pipilo chlorurus—Seen by most of the group on the ground at Bryce Canyon

Spotted Towhee Pipilo maculatus—Seen on one day in Zion, in Bryce, and at Calf Creek Recreation Area

YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT: Icteriidae (1)

Yellow-breasted Chat *Icteria virens*—This "former warbler" was found at Calf Creek Recreation Area and at Capitol Reef National Park

NEW WORLD BLACKBIRDS: Icteridae (7)

Yellow-headed Blackbird *Xanthocephalus* —Seen on all days at Ruby's Inn by the lake and at the pond behind Boulder Mountain Lodge

Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta—Seen and heard at Capitol Reef Resort

Bullock's Oriole *Icterus bullockii*—A group favorite, these were seen on 4 days at several sites with cottonwood riparian habitat

Red-winged Blackbird *Agelaius phoeniceus*—Found on 3 days in appropriate wetland habitat, such as at Jackson Flat Reservoir and by the lake at Ruby's Inn

Brown-headed Cowbird *Molothrus ater*—Seen on 2 days at Calf Creek Recreation area and in Capitol Reef National Park **Brewer's Blackbird** *Euphagus cyanocephalus*—Seen very well by the group on all the days at Ruby's Inn **Great-tailed Grackle** *Quiscalus mexicanus*—Found at Jackson Flat Reservoir on the first visit

NEW WORLD WARBLERS: Parulidae (6)

Lucy's Warbler Leiothlypis luciae—Seen at Grafton

Common Yellowthroat Geothlypis trichas—(GO) Found by Dave on one morning at Ruby's Inn

Yellow Warbler *Setophaga petechia*—By far are most regularly encountered warbler, these were seen on 6 days of the tour at pretty much every site with tall cottonwoods

Yellow-rumped Warbler *Setophaga coronata*—Individuals of the Audubon's form were seen on 2 days at high elevation forested sites at the North Rim and Bryce Canyon

Grace's Warbler *Setophaga graciae*—This lovely warbler of the Ponderosa Pine was found near the east entrance to Zion and at Bryce Canyon

Black-throated Gray Warbler *Setophaga nigrescens*—Only found on 1 day, but 2 times that day, at stops on the way to the east entrance to Zion; a true pinyon-juniper habitat specialist

CARDINAL, GROSBEAKS, AND ALLIES: Cardinalidae (3)

Summer Tanager *Piranga rubra*—Found on the first 2 days of the tour, first in Zion National Park while hiking along the Virgin River, and then again at Grafton

Western Tanager *Piranga ludoviciana*—Found on 4 days of the tour, probably a combination of breeding birds and migrants, at Grafton, Jacob Lake Inn, Cannonville, and Capitol Reef Resort

Black-headed Grosbeak *Pheucticus melanocephalus*—Found on 3 days of the tour, first at Zion and again at Cannonville and in Capitol Reef National Park

MAMMALS (11 species recorded):

Bighorn Sheep *Ovis canadensis*—A small group seen on the side of the road when leaving Zion through the east entrance

Mule Deer *Odocoileus hemionus*—Found on 3 days of the tour at several sites, generally at slightly lower elevations and many times while driving

Desert Cottontail Sylvilagus audubonii—The common "bunny rabbit" of the tour, these were seen on several days at a few sites

Utah Prairie Dog Cynomys parvidens—Well seen at an established colony inside Bryce Canyon National Park

Yellow-bellied Marmot Marmota flaviventris—Found at Fruita in Capitol Reef National Park

White-tailed Antelope Squirrel Ammospermophilus leucurus—Seen in Grand Wash at Capitol Reef National Park

Golden-mantled Ground Squirrel Callospermophilus lateralis—Observed regularly at Bryce Canyon

Rock Squirrel *Otospermophilus variegatus*—Found on 3 days of the tour, they were most readily seen (and quite tame) in Zion National Park

Uinta Chipmunk Neotamias umbrinus—The common and regularly seen small rodent at Bryce Canyon

Hopi Chipmunk *Neotamias rufus*—Several of these were running around the rocks and feeding under the feeder at Calf Creek Recreation Area

Muskrat Ondatra zibethicus—One seen in the lake at Ruby's Inn

REPTILES AND AMPHIBIANS (4 species recorded):

Common Side-blotched Lizard *Uta stansburiana*—Seen well and photographed on the Grand Wash hike in Capitol Reef National Park

Common Sagebrush Lizard *Sceloporus graciosus*—One photographed by Dave at Grand Canyon National Park, North Rim

Yellow-backed Spiny Lizard Sceloporus uniformis—One seen on a tree at Grafton

Canyon Tree Frog *Dryophytes arenicolor*—Several of these were observed sitting on a rock at the Middle Emerald Pool, Zion National Park

Day 2: May 18, 2022: Springdale, Grafton, Zion East Entrance, Checkerboard Mesa, Jackson Flat Reservoir, Kanab

Day 3: May 19, 2022: North Rim, Grand Canyon National Park, Jacob Lake Inn

Day 4: May 20, 2022: Jackson Flat Reservoir; Red Canyon Visitor Center, Dixie National Forest; Bryce Canyon National Park (Sunset and Sunrise Points); Ruby's Inn

Day 5: May 21, 2022: Ruby's Inn, Mossy Cave, Bryce Canyon National Park, Tropic

Day 6: May 22, 2022: Ruby's Inn; Tropic; Cannonville Visitor Center, Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument; Escalante Interagency Visitor Center; Boulder Mountain Lodge; Calf Creek Recreation Area; Capitol Reef Resort, Torrey

Day 7: May 23, 2022: Capitol Reef Resort, Capitol Reef National Park (Petroglyphs, Grand Wash, Fruita, Scenic Drive)
