Family or Species Common Name: Scientific Name

DUCKS, GEESE, AND SWANS: Anatidae — (6)

Canada Goose Branta canadensis — Seen in small groups at multiple locations on five different days.

Wood Duck *Aix sponsa* — Great Plains Nature Center.

Blue-winged Teal Spatula discors — Most common ducks spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Northern Shoveler *Spatula clypeata* — Multiple birds seen at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Gadwall Mareca strepera — Numerous, swimming in roadside marshes at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos — Several seen below the walking bridge at Great Plains Nature Center and at Cheyenne Bottoms.

NEW WORLD QUAIL: Odontophoridae — (1)

Northern Bobwhite *Colinus virginianus* — Seen and heard on multiple days in both Smoky Hills and Flint Hills.

PARTRIDGES, PHEASANTS, AND ALLIES: Phasianidae — (1)

Wild Turkey *Meleagris gallopavo* — A group of seven turkeys were seen in a field returning from Mushroom Rocks.

GREBES: Podicipedidae — (1)

Pied-billed Grebe *Podilymbus podiceps* — Seen in roadside marshes at Cheyenne Bottoms.

<u>PIGEONS AND DOVES: Columbidae — (3)</u>

Rock Pigeon (I) Columba livia — Seen every day of the tour, often in towns.

Eurasian Collared-Dove (I) *Streptopelia decaocto* — Seen every tour of the tour, often in towns.

Mourning Dove Zenaida macroura — Likely the most common bird on our tour, large numbers seen daily.

NIGHTJARS: Caprimulgidae — (2)

Common Nighthawk *Chordeiles minor* — Spotted in Lindsborg and Manhattan.

Common Poorwill *Phalaenoptilus nuttallii* — Heard on Klataske Ranch.

SWIFTS: Apodidae — (1)

Chimney Swift Chaetura pelagica — Seen most days of the tour, often in towns.

<u>HUMMINGBIRDS: Trochilidae — (1)</u>

Ruby-throated Hummingbird *Archilochus colubris* — Individual birds spotted on three different days; one in Cottonwood Falls.

RAILS, COOTS, AND ALLIES: Rallidae — (1)

American Coot *Fulica americana* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

STILTS AND AVOCETS: Recurvirostridae — (1)

American Avocet *Recurvirostra americana* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

PLOVERS AND LAPWINGS: Charadriidae — (1)

Killdeer Charadrius vociferus — Spotted on two days, many seen in the marshes at Cheyenne Bottoms.

SANDPIPERS AND ALLIES: Scolopacidae — (5)

Baird's Sandpiper *Calidris bairdii* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Least Sandpiper *Calidris minutilla* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Long-billed Dowitcher *Limnodromus scolopaceus* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Wilson's Snipe *Gallinago delicata* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Greater Yellowlegs *Tringa melanoleuca* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

GULLS AND TERNS: Laridae — (3)

Franklin's Gull Leucophaeus pipixcan — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms and Kanopolis Reservoir.

Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms and Council Grove Reservoir.

Black Tern Chlidonias niger — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae — (1)

Double-crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

PELICANS: Pelecanidae — (1)

American White Pelican *Pelecanus erythrorhynchos* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms and Kanopolis Reservoir.

HERONS AND EGRETS: Ardeidae — (3)

Great Blue Heron *Ardea herodias* — Another common bird on our tour, seen daily, often along streams, rivers, marshes and lakes.

Great Egret *Ardea alba* — Seen on two days, many spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Snowy Egret *Egretta thula* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

IBIS AND SPOONBILLS: Threskiornithidae — (1)

White-faced Ibis Plegadis chihi — Stunning flocks seen flying and wading at Cheyenne Bottoms.

NEW WORLD VULTURES: Cathartidae — (1)

Turkey Vulture Cathartes aura — Commonly seen soaring every day of tour.

OSPREY: Pandionidae — (1)

Osprey Pandion haliaetus — Spotted at the Land Institute.

<u>HAWKS, KITES, AND EAGLES: Accipitridae — (6)</u>

Northern Harrier *Circus hudsonius* — Spotted soaring above the dykes at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Cooper's Hawk Accipiter cooperii — Spotted at the Land Institute.

Bald Eagle *Haliaeetus leucocephalus* — Spotted along road after leaving Maxwell.

Mississippi Kite *Ictinia mississippiensis* — Spotted on the road to Cheyenne Bottoms.

Sharp-shinned Hawk *Accipiter striatus* — Spotted at Great Plains Nature Center.

Red-tailed Hawk Buteo jamaicensis — Seen most days, often along roadsides.

WOODPECKERS: Picidae — (4)

Red-headed Woodpecker *Melanerpes erythrocephalus* — Spotted at the Land Institute and multiple locations in the Flint Hills.

Red-bellied Woodpecker *Melanerpes carolinus* — Seen at multiple locations, most days.

Downy Woodpecker *Dryobates pubescens* — Seen at multiple locations in the Flint Hills.

Northern Flicker Colaptes auratus — Seen at the Great Plains Nature Center and at other locations in the Smoky Hills.

FALCONS AND CARACARAS: Falconidae — (1)

American Kestrel Falco sparverius — Seen on multiple days, often along roadsides.

TYRANT FLYCATCHERS: Tyrannidae — (4)

Western Kingbird Tyrannus verticalis — Seen in both the Smoky Hills and at Flint Hills.

Eastern Kingbird *Tyrannus tyrannus* — Most active along wooded edges and meadows at Great Plains Nature Center, seen multiple days.

Scissor-tailed Flycatcher *Tyrannus forficatus* — Spotted in Flint Hills, including a group of at least 26 on backsroads, in fields and hedgerows; one of the birding highlights of the tour.

Eastern Phoebe Sayornis phoebe — Seen in the Flint Hills.

CROWS AND JAYS: Corvidae — (2)

Blue Jay *Cyanocitta cristata* — Common, seen daily.

American Crow *Corvus brachyrhynchos* — Common, seen daily.

<u>TITS AND CHICKADEES: Paridae — (2)</u>

Black-capped Chickadee *Poecile atricapillus* — Common, seen most days.

Tufted Titmouse Baeolophus bicolor — Spotted at Konza Prairie.

SWALLOWS AND MARTINS: Hirundinidae — (3)

Tree Swallow *Tachycineta bicolor* — Spotted in the Flint Hills at Pioneer Bluffs.

Barn Swallow *Hirundo rustica* — Common, especially in small towns.

Cliff Swallow *Petrochelidon pyrrhonota* — Spotted at Cheyenne Bottoms.

WAXWINGS: Bombycillidae — (1)

Cedar Waxwing Bombycilla cedrorum — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center, Mt. Mitchell and at Flint Hills.

MOCKINGBIRDS AND THRASHERS: Mimidae — (3)

Gray Catbird *Dumetella carolinensis* — Seen at the Great Plains Nature Center.

Brown Thrasher *Toxostoma rufum* — Active and abundant at the Great Plains Nature Center, and seen at Flint Hills.

Northern Mockingbird *Mimus polyglottos* — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center.

STARLINGS AND MYNAS: Sturnidae — (1)

European Starling (I) Sturnus vulgaris — Very common, seen most days, at times in large flocks.

THRUSHES: Turdidae — (2)

Eastern Bluebird Sialia sialis — Spotted at Pioneer Bluffs.

American Robin Turdus migratorius — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center, Dyck and in the Flint Hills.

OLD WORLD SPARROWS: Passeridae — (1)

House Sparrow (I) Passer domesticus — Common, often seen in towns.

FINCHES AND EUPHONIAS: Fringillidae — (2)

House Finch *Haemorhous mexicanus* — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center and Dyck.

American Goldfinch Spinus tristis — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center, Flint Hills.

NEW WORLD SPARROWS: Passerellidae — (1)

Lark Sparrow *Chondestes grammacus* — Spotted on route to Tallgrass Prairie National Preserve at same location as Scissor-tailed Flycatchers.

NEW WORLD BLACKBIRDS: Icteridae — (6)

Yellow-headed Blackbird Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus — Many seen at Cheyenne Bottoms.

Eastern Meadowlark Sturnella magna — Unusually absent from the landscape, finally spotted near Tallgrass Prairie Preserve.

Western Meadowlark Sturnella neglecta — Unusually absent from the landscape.

Red-winged Blackbird *Agelaius phoeniceus* — Seen on multiple days in both parts of the state.

Common Grackle *Quiscalus quiscula* — Common, seen on multiple days.

Great-tailed Grackle Quiscalus mexicanus — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center and at Cheyenne Bottoms.

<u>CARDINALS, GROSBEAKS, AND ALLIES: Cardinalidae — (3)</u>

Northern Cardinal *Cardinalis cardinalis* — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center.

Summer Tanager Piranga rubra— Spotted at Konza Prairie.

American Redstart *Setophaga ruticilla*— Spotted at Konza Prairie.

MAMMALS: -(9)

Nine-banded Armadillo Dasypus novemcinctus — Roadkill, sadly, on most days.

Eastern Cottontail Sylvilagus floridanus — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center and in the Flint Hills.

Fox Squirrel *Sciurus niger* — Common, seen most days.

Black-tailed Prairie Dog Cynomys ludovicianus — Spotted in a prairie dog town near Cheyenne Bottoms.

White-tailed Deer Odocoileus virginianus — Spotted at the Great Plains Nature Center and seen in fields on multiple days.

American Bison *Bison bison* — Seen at Maxwell and at the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve.

Common Raccoon *Procyon lotor* — Spotted near Klataske Ranch.

Opossum *Didelphis virginiana* — Spotted near Klataske Ranch.

Coyote *Canis latrans* — Heard at the Tallgrass Prairie National Preserve.

REPTILES: -(4)

Eastern Collared Lizard Crotaphytus collaris — Seen on the Konza hiking trail.

Common Gartersnake *Thamnophis sirtalis* — Spotted on the trail at the Great Plains Nature Center.

Northern Watersnake *Aspidocelis sexlineatus* — Spotted at the Tallgrass Prairie National Preserve.

"Red-eared" Pond Slider Trachemys scripta— Spotted at Dyck.
